- I. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance Chair Stanton Cross opened the Regular School Committee Meeting at 6:31 pm. with a quorum of the members present, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.
- II. Comments and Statements from the Public There were none.

III. Informational Agenda

C. <u>Acknowledgement of John and Abigail Adams Scholarship Recipients - (taken out of order)</u> Ms. Charette distributed letters and certificates to the five honorees of the John and Abigail Adams Scholarship.

A. Student Representatives:

Ryan Keane reported term 3 progress report were posted to the Community Portal yesterday, Parent Teacher Conferences will be March 13, February newsletter has a link to MCAS testing dates, registration deadline for next year's LEAP Program is March 8, Spring sports registration is now open, congratulations to the Drama Club for the SpongeBob performance.

John Jack Keane reported the Sophomore class is selling Westport Wildcat t-shirts, Senior trip will be May 6 to Six Flags, Seniors will be holding a Powderpuff game March 28, Seniors are having a Krispy Crème Donut Fundraiser until March 20, Drama Club will be performing Sister Act on April 5,6,7, STEEL (Students That Exemplify Extraordinary Leadership) will be hosting a Prom Pop Up Shop March 9, Westport Music Boosters is having a Spring Candy Fundraiser until March 15, Westport Cornhole Tournament will be March 9, congratulations was given to Avery Carvalho for being awarded Daughters of the American Revolutions' Good Citizens Award and to Avery Avila for completing the Harvard University's Future Doctor Program, sports information was announced for girls basketball and co-op hockey, March 13 a Spring Sports Informational Session will take place.

B. <u>Superintendent Report</u> – Superintendent Aubin gave a shout out to the entire faculty on Tuesday's Professional Development Day, where staff help present on SEL. Another shout out was given to the whole staff for the amount of time people put in for events to happen. Mr. Aubin shared that he is proud of the work being done in the district.

A thank you was given to the School Committee for their generous support of the Harvard Education Program that provides unique learning opportunities for students.

- D. <u>Staff and Student Attendance Reports</u> Chair Stanton Cross reported that committee members received copies of the reports and asked if there were any comments or questions? There were none.
- E. <u>NEASC report</u> Ms. Charette reported there was a collaborate conference visit from New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC) on December 5 and 6, 2023. The last evaluation was done in Spring of 2013. They were graded on foundational elements with an area of concern with writing curriculum.

Four priorities were outlined:

- 1. Written curriculum
- 2. Vision of graduate is known and understood by all members of the school community and develop a process to assess and communicate individual and whole school progress toward achieving the vision of the graduate.
- 3. Add new programs and modify existing programs and systems to support students with social emotional disabilities. (Westport does Response to Intervention (RTI)
- 4. School insures all students are active learners and lead their own learning.

Ms. Charette added that NEASC will be back in 2 years and the focus will be on work done toward these 4 priority areas.

F. <u>Wildcat Performing Arts Proposal</u> – Ms. Charette explained the Wildcat Performing Arts proposal. This course is a non-credit course for students in Drama Club or Pep Band in lieu of the VPA graduation requirement.

Chair Stanton Cross requested to place this item on the Action Agenda for the next meeting.

G. <u>Leap Program Update</u> – Ms. Charette reported that applications are due tomorrow for next year's LEAP program. Ms. Charette gave an update on the LEAP Program for this year. A total of 11 students participated. Five students were enrolled as early LEAP students and took all core classes and electives at the High School. These students will be getting 30 credits at the end of their 8th grade year, making them sophomores at the beginning of next school year. These 5 students also took on a Capstone Project. Six students were enrolled in the dual program and took core courses with 8th grade teams and took electives at the High School mostly in Art, Foreign Language, and Physical Education.

Ms. Charette shared the program has been highly successful. They had an informational session on February 15 with 30 families attending.

In addition, they obtained a grant for a LEAP Summer Institute Program from the Westport Education Foundation.

Chair Stanton Cross asked if the senior project as a graduation requirement has been removed? Ms. Charette is looking at the graduation requirements and will review them with the committee in the next few months.

H. <u>Discussion of School Choice Program</u> – Ms. Charette reported that this past year's school choice offered 10 students in grade 9, 10 students in grade 10, 5 students in grade 11, and 5 students in grade 12.

After reviewing this school year, Ms. Charette recommends to keep grades 9,10, and 11 the same, but have zero students for grade 12.

It was recommended to add 5 students in grades 7 and 5 students in grade 8.

I. <u>Discussion of SePac Unified Sports at WES</u> – There was a correction on the agenda. Agenda item should read I. Discussion of Unified Sports at WES - Chair Stanton Cross mentioned the committee requested more information on how Unified Sports was going to be implemented.

Mr. Aguiar went over the change from Chess Club to Unified Activities Advisor as well as core components to be considered a Unified Champion School. Whole School Engagement, Inclusive Youth Leadership and Unified Sports was also explained.

Chair Stanton Cross requested for this to be on the Action Agenda for next meeting to approve unified sports at WES and to authorize Mr. Aguiar to appoint Theresa Pacheco as Unified Activities Advisor and remove chess club. Mr. Aguiar will provide an update on other clubs.

J. WCS Bill Warrant: 2/23/2024 & 3/8/2024 - Chair Stanton Cross reported bill warrant dated 2/23/2024 in the amount of \$509,584.65 and bill warrant dated 3/8/2024 in the amount of \$186,459.91 was emailed to school committee members for review. Members also have a hardcopy of the bill warrants.

Chair Stanton Cross asked if there were any questions on the bill warrants? There were none.
