

## NOTICE OF BOND ELECTION

TO THE RESIDENT, QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE  
ARGYLE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT

TAKE NOTICE that an election will be held in the Argyle Independent School District on May 4, 2024 concerning the issuance of bonds in accordance with an order that reads substantially as follows:

### ORDER CALLING A BOND ELECTION FOR MAY 4, 2024

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of the Argyle Independent School District (the "District") deems it advisable to call the bond election hereinafter ordered (the "Election"); and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds and determines that the anticipated capital improvements identified in Proposition A may be submitted to the qualified voters of the District as a single proposition pursuant to Section 45.003(g) of the Code because these capital improvements will be predominantly used for educational and administrative purposes, none of which are the type of facilities described in Section 45.003(g)(1) – (6); and

WHEREAS, the Election is subject to the provisions of Section 45.003, Texas Education Code, and the District is contracting with Denton County, Texas (the "County") for the administration of the Election pursuant to an interlocal agreement with the County (the "Election Contract"); and

WHEREAS, the County, acting through its Elections Administrator (the "Elections Administrator") in accordance with the Election Contract will provide for the administration of the Election; and

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Order was adopted was open to the public, and public notice of the time, place, and purpose of the meeting was given, all as required by the Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE ARGYLE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT:

**Section 1. Findings.** The statements contained in the preamble of this Order are true and correct and adopted as findings of fact and operative provisions hereof.

**Section 2. Election Ordered; Polling Places.** The Election shall be held in the District between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. on May 4, 2024 ("Election Day"). The Election is to be conducted by the County, as provided by Chapter 271, Texas Election Code (the "Code") at the locations designated by the Elections Administrator in accordance with the provisions of the Election Contract, which the President and Secretary of the Board of Trustees and the Superintendent of the District are hereby authorized to execute in the name of said District. The locations of such polling places are set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto. Exhibit A shall be modified to include additional or different Election Day polling places designated by the Elections Administrator and to conform to the Election Contract.

**Section 3. Early Voting.** Early voting shall be administered by the County. Early voting shall be conducted by personal appearance at the locations and during the period early voting is required or permitted by law, being April 22, 2024 through April 30, 2024, on the dates and at the times set forth in

Exhibit B attached hereto. Exhibit B shall be modified to include additional or different early voting locations designated by the Elections Administrator and to conform to the Election Contract.

**Section 4. Election Officials.** The appointment of the Presiding Election Judge, Alternate Judges, Early Voting Clerks, the Presiding Judge of the early ballot board and other election officials for the Election shall be made by the Elections Administrator in accordance with the Election Contract and the Code. The Elections Administrator may employ other personnel necessary for the proper administration of the Election, including such part-time help as is necessary to prepare for the Election, to ensure the timely delivery of supplies during early voting and on Election Day, and for the efficient tabulation of ballots at the central counting station. The Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the Superintendent, President, Vice President or the Secretary of the Board of Trustees to execute or attest on behalf of the District the Election Contract with the County.

**Section 5. Voting by Mail.** Applications for voting by mail for all residents of the District shall submitted by personal delivery not later than April 23, 2024, or shall be mailed to the address below and received (not postmarked) by April 23, 2024:

**Section 6. Early Voting Ballots.** An Early Voting Ballot Board shall be created to process early voting results of the Election and the Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board shall be designated by the Elections Administrator. The Presiding Judge of the Early Voting Ballot Board shall appoint two or more additional members to constitute the Early Voting Ballot Board members and, if needed, the Signature Verification Committee members required to efficiently process the early voting ballots.

**Section 7. Qualified Voters.** All qualified electors of and residing in the District, shall be entitled to vote at the election.

**Section 8. Propositions.** At the Election the following PROPOSITIONS shall be submitted in accordance with law:

Shall the Board of Trustees of the Argyle Independent School District be authorized to issue the bonds of the District, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of \$482,385,000 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, renovating and equipping school facilities, the purchase of necessary sites for school facilities, and the purchase of school buses and vehicles, with the bonds to mature, bear interest, and be issued and sold in accordance with law at the time of issuance; and shall the Board of Trustees be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?

Shall the Board of Trustees of the Argyle Independent School District be authorized to issue the bonds of the District, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of

\$22,655,000 for the purpose of constructing, acquiring, and equipping a baseball and softball complex at Argyle High School in Canyon Falls, with the bonds to mature, bear interest, and be issued and sold in accordance with law at the time of issuance; and shall the Board of Trustees be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?

ARGYLE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT SPECIAL ELECTION  
ARGYLE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPOSITION C

Shall the Board of Trustees of the Argyle Independent School District be authorized to issue the bonds of the District, in one or more series, in the aggregate principal amount of \$6,500,000 for the purpose of acquiring and replacing instructional technology equipment, with the bonds to mature, bear interest, and be issued and sold in accordance with law at the time of issuance; and shall the Board of Trustees be authorized to levy and pledge, and cause to be assessed and collected, annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds?

**Section 9. Ballots.** The official ballots for the Election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote “FOR” or “AGAINST” the aforesaid PROPOSITIONS with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITIONS to be expressed substantially as follows:

**Section 10. Compliance with Federal Law.** In all respects, the Election shall be conducted in accordance with the Code. Pursuant to the federal Help America Vote Act (“HAVA”) and the Code, at each polling place there shall be at least one voting system that is equipped for disabled individuals, and each such voting system shall be a system that has been certified by the Texas Secretary of State as compliant with HAVA and the Code. The District hereby finds that the voting systems to be used by the Elections Administrator in administering the Election is such a system, and orders that such voting equipment or other equipment certified by the Texas Secretary of State shall be used by the District in its elections.

**Section 11. Debt Obligations.** The following information is provided in accordance with the provisions of Section 3.009(b), Texas Election Code.

(a) The proposition language that will appear on the ballot is set forth in Section 9 hereof.

(b) The purpose for which the bonds are to be authorized is set forth in Section 8 hereof.

(c) The principal amount of the debt obligations to be authorized is \$482,385,000 for Proposition A, \$22,655,000 for Proposition B, and \$6,500,000 for Proposition C.

(d) If the bonds are approved by the voters, the Board of Trustees will be authorized to levy annual ad valorem taxes, on all taxable property in the District, sufficient, without limit as to rate or amount, to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds and the cost of any credit agreements executed in connection with the bonds.

(e) Based upon the bond market conditions at the date of adoption of this Order, the maximum interest rate for any series of the bonds is estimated to be 5.250%. Such estimate takes into account a number of factors, including the issuance schedule, maturity schedule and the expected bond ratings of the proposed bonds and notes. Such estimated maximum interest rate is provided as a matter of information but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds or notes, or any series thereof, may be sold.

(f) If the bonds are approved, they may be issued in one or more series, to mature serially, over a period not to exceed 40 years from the date of issuance of each series of bonds.

(g) The aggregate amount of the outstanding principal of the District’s debt obligations as of the date of this Order is \$408,721,443.

(h) The aggregate amount of the outstanding interest of the District’s debt obligations as of the date of this Order is \$290,513,141.

(i) The ad valorem debt service tax rate for the District as of the date of this Order is \$0.50 per \$100 of taxable assessed valuation.

<sup>(1)</sup> The interest on the proposed bonds was estimated at a rate not to exceed 5.25% based on market conditions as of February 5, 2024, and therefore, the interest payable on the proposed bonds may be less than, or more than, the amounts set forth above based on market conditions at the time of sale of the proposed bonds.

Based on the information and assumptions provided in the table above, the estimated maximum annual increase in the amount of taxes that would be imposed on a residence homestead in the District with a taxable appraised value of \$100,000 to repay the proposed bonds, if approved, is \$260.50. This estimate assumes growth of the District's taxable assessed valuation at a compound annual growth rate of 12.7% between fiscal year 2025 and 2034 and constant thereafter and assumes the bonds are structured with a 30-year amortization to meet a \$0.5000 I&S tax rate target in fiscal years 2025 – 2032 with relatively level debt service thereafter.

This estimate assumes growth of the District’s taxable assessed valuation at a compound annual growth rate of 12.7% between fiscal year 2025 and 2034 and constant thereafter and assumes the bonds are structured with a 30-year amortization to meet a \$0.5000 I&S tax rate target in fiscal years 2025 – 2032 with relatively level debt service thereafter.
