About HMS

Campus

Our campus just north of Hudson, Ohio is designed to be child-friendly and to inspire young minds to discover the world around them firsthand. Our school is situated on 12-acres, equipped with an indoor gymnasium and a contained playground area with ageappropriate equipment. Our enclosed back woods feature additional outdoor enrichment opportunities. We also fortunate to be located close to off-campus attractions and parks.

HMS Summer Staff

All of our programs are staffed by talented and dedicated camp counselors and staff who are passionate about working with children -- many of whom are also HMS faculty, staff, or alumni. Our summer staff also receives first aid and CPR/AED training and exposure. Enrichment Camps are staffed independently by leaders in their respective fields that inspire children to create, discover, and explore the world around them.

Arrival & Dismissal

Detailed instructions will be sent via email as the start of each camp approaches. Staff and signage will also be available to guide students to their respective camps.
Each camper should be picked up by a parent or adult listed as approved on their release form for pick-up. If a counselor is not familiar with the person picking up the camper, they may be asked to provide a photo ID before the child is released.

Schedule Flexibility with Before Care and After Care Available

We offer the option of adding before care (7:30am to beginning of camp in morning) or after care (end of camp in the afternoon -5:30pm) if applicable to that camp. As a result, we can accomodate campers from as early as 7:30am until as late as 5:30pm daily.

Lunch and Snack Time

All-day campers are to bring a healthy and nutritious lunch, beverage, and a snack. Half-day campers should bring a water bottle and snack. Unless otherwise noted in a camp's description, lunch is not provided by Hudson Montessori School. If a camper's programming extends beyond Noon, please plan to bring a packed lunch.




Overview of Summer at HMS

NEW for Summer 2024 - Registration online via Homeroom

We are excited to enter into a partnership with Homeroom, a platform that specializes in solutions to manage summer camps and extended day programming. For you the parent, it will have a user-friendly interface that will allow you to read camp descriptions, while browsing our offerings, during the registration process. Furthermore, once you register and pay for a camp, Homeroom will provide a calendar of the activities your family has signed up for, along with active receipts and record keeping (that can be accessed at anytime by you for tax purposes, etc). All families need to do is make a quick account with Homeroom, when prompted, during the registration process for summer camps at HMS. The platform will also help streamline our communications between HMS and you, our summer families. We will be able to send out group emails and texts to communicate any relevant updates to camp in real-time as needed during the summer.

Registration is on a first-come and first-served basis. Early registration is encouraged. All programs are subject to a minimum enrollment and cancellation if not met. In the event that a class is full or cancelled, parents will be notified as soon as possible. Registration forms, medical release forms, and waivers are available on our website. Registration is online at HudsonMontessori.org/Summer.

Deposit & Refund Policy

A deposit of at least 50% of total camp fees is due at time of registration; remaining balance will be setup to be paid equally on the 15th of each month between registration and June 15. (For example, if somone signs up on February 8, they would be charged 50% on February 8, with the remaining 50% due being spread out equally on March 15, April 15, May 15, and June 15. The payment method, credit card or ACH, initially used will be charged automatically on those dates).

A refund must be requested prior to May 15. There is a \$50 non-refundable processing fee for each camp's cancellation on part of the parent. No refund is given for the the inital 50% deposit. If HMS cancels a camp, a full refund will be given. No refunds are given for a child who arrives late, leaves early, or comes to only a part of a session.

Transportation Available to/from HMS

We offer transportation within the Greater Hudson Area, including nearby towns in Summit, Portage, Cuyahoga, and Geuga counties. We hope this transportation gives families more flexibility by providing to/from travel to HMS. All campers who register for transportation receive free Beforeand After-Care. Create-Your-Day Camps

Create-Your-Day Camp offers the

opportunity to learn new ideas and interact with your fellow campers on a daily basis. Each week has its own transformative theme designed with an emphasis on encouraging campers to step outside their comfort zone. Campers will be guided by our experienced staff through a Montessori-inspired curriculum. Full-day campers should bring a lunch, 1-2 snacks, and a water bottle. Homerooms for CYD camp hold a maximum of 20-25 campers with at least 3 staff per room.

For Ages 3 and Above! In the past, Create Your Day has provided a multitude of combinations for camp attendance ranging from as a little one-half day per week to full days all week long. Full-week campers will be given priority registration until May 1. After May 1, Registration will then be open to part-time (1-4 day) campers, if space is available. 



Camp Explore!

Welcome to Camp Explore!

Camp Explore offers the opportunity for campers to discover the world around them, while also enjoying traditional camp favorites. Over the course of each week, campers will explore the rich history and culture of Northeast Ohio. Every week will have its own transformative theme meant to enlighten and illuminate a new aspect of our surrounding community.

In addition to exploring the new theme for each week, students will participate in traditional camp outings. The excursions will vary week-to-week like hiking, biking, wilderness skills, and more among others in the Cuyahoga Valley National Park, but we will kayak once each week. Even when partaking on these adventures, the opportunity to engage the content never ends. Through the many field trips and excursions, campers will be able to make further connections to the place they call home.

This camp is designed to build off the natural curiosity of our campers. Geared towards children ages 7 years and above, we want to fully capture what it is to be a native Ohioan while also enjoying the hallmarks of a traditional summer camp — all while staying in your backyard. Camp will be limited to 16 campers/week to foster an intimate learning environment.

Full-day campers should bring a lunch, 1-2 snacks, and a water bottle. Each week of Camp Explore comes with complimentary Beforeand After-Care which allows students to arrive as early as 7:30am and be picked up as late as 5:30pm daily.

Camp Explore! — Weekly Themes

Exploring Hudson June 17 - 20

There's no better place to start our exploration of our local area than our town itself. We will learn all about Hudson, from its people to the movements it played a vital role in shaping our country. We will cover the role Hudson and citizens like Owen and John Brown played in the abolitionist movement in the forecoming shadow of the Civil War. We will explore Hudson's place originally as a territory of Connecticut as the Western Reserve and the role pioneers played in shaping this community. In addition, we will investigate how Hudson developed into a modern town, owing to the many contributions of James W. Ellswoth. We will seek out the help of local historians.

Conservation in Ohio July 8 - 12

The rise of industry and factories in our area had its consequences as well. Following the Cuyahoga River catching on fire infamously in 1969, the call to action led Northeast Ohio to serve as the epicenter for the American environmental movement. Ultimately, this lead to the passage of the Clean Water Act - at its forefront was the preservation and establishment of the Cuyahoga Valley National Park and the metro parks we enjoy today. As a result, we will explore the many features of the CVNP as we look to walk some of its trails, take a ride on the scenic railroad, and explore its watersheds during our weekly kayak excursions. In addition, we will also explore the side of animal conservation by visiting the Akron Zoo.

From 1890 - 1970, the Akron-Cleveland area was in the top ten populated areas in the United States. People were drawn to this area by the role Ohio industry played in this region's growth. From being the center of the rubber industry in Akron to serving as the home to such industrial titans like John D. Rockefeller, Ohio helped propel the nation through great advances in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. Even today, that spirit of innovation continues through our area's connection to the final frontier - space - via the NASA Glenn Research Center. Ohioans still have that yearning to discover and invent the next big thing. We will plan on a visit to the Great Lakes Science Center too.

Pastimes in Ohio July 22 - 26

As you know very well, Northeast Ohio is passionate about sports and the teams it supports. Throughout the last century, Northeast Ohio has been intimately connected to many of our nation's pastimes, with baseball and football at the forefront. We will partake in an Akron Rubberducks (Guardians affiliate) baseball game as they play a day game on Tuesday versus the Bowie Baysox (Orioles affiliate). In addition, we will travel to the Pro Football Hall of Fame. As luck would have it, the Summit County Fair is held this week too, so we will be sure to try to visit it while learning about the role county fairs play in Ohio.

Art and Culture July 15 - 19

Northeast Ohio has a deepy engrained connection to the arts and the cultural movements that often helped them rise. We will explore how Cleveland came to be the birthplace of rock and roll, leading to it later becoming the host of the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame (which we will be sure to visit). In addition, we will learn about the visual and musical art that is right in our backyard as well — with both the Akron and world-renown Cleveland Orchestra. We will reach out to local members of each, along also visiting a local art musuem. And of course, we will make our own art and connect with local artists!

Junior Vet camp is an in-depth first experience for elementary students exploring what it's like to help animals! We'll explore hospitalizing patients with your own stuffed animal and role-playing as stuffed animal surgeons. Campers will learn real life skills like how to de-skunk a dog. New activities are added every year, and this year there will be animal eye activities and horse endoscopy. Campers will experience the fellowship of being with other animal lovers especially as they are guided by pre-veterinary students of Kent State University! (Who are joining us for the first time in 2024.)

During a camp day, campers are guided through veterinary inspired activities and crafts that will leave you feeling like a nurturing caretaker and a knowledgeable explorer. Campers will create a basis for learning future concepts in medicine and physics as we explore through free-play and games. There are over 40 original and unique activities that are replicated nowhere else and that you will only be able to experience at Hudson Montessori. Each camp day will have its own theme and variety of different activities. These include hallmark activities like skeleton scavenger hunt and making your own stethescope. 




