Superintendent Report

- Our remote Spanish Teacher through Elevate is a licensed teacher in the State of New York. She lives in Puerto Rico and had to take a day off because there was no power from the hurricane. There were no issues with finding a sub for the day.

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- We met with the architects on the Rensselaer Park Capital Project. They will be attending the October Workshop for give a presentation.
- We are working on enrollment projections. This information will be share with you by Mrs. Klime at the December Workshop which will focus on budget.
- TSL is having some staffing issues that we are addressing with them. Some of our staff have been helping out in the mornings because TSL does not have enough coverage.
- At our upcoming Administrative Team Meeting we will be participating in a Tabletop Exercise with Risk Management from Questar III BOCES. They give our administrators a very realistic emergency to deal with and they have to figure out the best way to handle the situation.
- We are having some issues with children who were homeschooled and moved out of the District. It is creating a lot of work for our registration staff. They remain registered with our District until they reregister in the district they moved to.
- We have seen a bit of an increase in COVID cases. 2-3 cases each week in each building.
- The State is returning to the issuance of K-12 Special Education certifications. They had broken the certification down to B-2, 1-6, 5-9 and 7-19. Because districts continue to see teacher shortages in this area, the State will be issuing K-12 certifications. The District has pledged \$100 to cover the cost of the certification for any of our staff who wants to apply for the new K-12 certification.
- Mrs. Fairhurst asked if we will be getting a second SRO. The Superintendent said we are still in discussion about it with the Police Department. They seem favorable to getting a second one for us.
