Mathematics

Algebra Review

Grade 9th-10th Credit: 0.5

Students will learn Real Numbers and Exponents, Geometric Transformations, Linear Relationships, Systems, and Functions, and patterns. This course does not meet Board of Regents requirements.

Algebra 1, Part 1 or 2 CR

Grade 9th-10th Credit: 0.5

Students will be exploring the following topics: Order of Operations, Simplifying Algebraic Expressions, Solving multi-step equations, Algebraic Word Problems, Slope and Intercepts, Graphing equations of lines, Parallel and Perpendicular Lines, Solving Inequalities, Solving Systems of Equations by Graphing, Substitution and Elimination, Operations with Polynomials, Factoring Polynomials, Solving Quadratic Equations by Factoring, Using Graphing Technology, and Word Problems Involving Rational Equations.

Geometry, Part 1 or 2 CR

Grade 10th – **11**th **Credit: 0.5**

Prerequisite: Algebra 1

In this course, students will learn about points, lines, and planes. They will learn about shapes and gain an understanding of how geometry affects the world around us. Topics will include: Segments and the coordinate plane, angles, parallel lines, triangles, proofs, and the Pythagorean Theorem.

Intermediate Algebra Part 1 CR

Credit: 0.5

Prerequisite: Algebra 1 and Geometry

This course reinforces existing algebra and geometry skills and explores concepts students will need to master in order to further their study of mathematics. **This** course does not meet Board of Regents requirements.

Astronomy Credit Advancement

Grade: 10th-12th Credit: 0.5 Semester 2 Only

This course will introduce students to the study of astronomy, including its history and development, basic scientific laws of motion and gravity, the concepts of modern astronomy, and the methods used by astronomers to learn more about the universe. Additional topics include the solar system, the Milky Way and other galaxies, and the sun and stars. Using online tools, students will examine the life cycle of stars, the properties of planets, and the exploration of space.

Forensic Science

Grade: 11th-12th Credit: 0.5

Prerequisite: Biology

This course focuses on some of the techniques and practices used by forensic scientists during a crime scene investigation (CSI). Starting with how clues and data are recorded and preserved, the student will follow evidence trails until the CSI goes to trial, examining how various elements of the crime scene are analyzed and processed. This course does not meet Board of Regents requirements.

Grade: 12th Credit: .5

Students will take on the role of a Washington, D.C. intern and spend time working throughout the nation's capital with all three branches of government. They will gain a greater understanding of the country's beginnings and how government functions at different levels.

Criminology Grade: 10th-12th Credit: 0.5

In this course, we will explore the field of criminology or the study of crime. In doing so, we will look at possible explanations for crime from psychological, biological, and sociological standpoints, explore the various types of crime and their consequences for society, and investigate how crime and criminals are handled by the criminal justice system.

World Religions Grade: 11th-12th Credit: 0.5

This course focuses on the major religions that have played a role in human history, including Buddhism, Christianity, Confucianism, Hinduism, Islam, Judaism, Shintoism, and Taoism. Students will trace the major developments in these religions and explore their relationships with social institutions and culture. The course will also discuss some of the similarities and differences among the major religions and examine the connections and influences they have.
