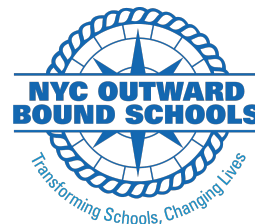


EL EDUCATION SCHOOL

NYC OUTWARD BOUND

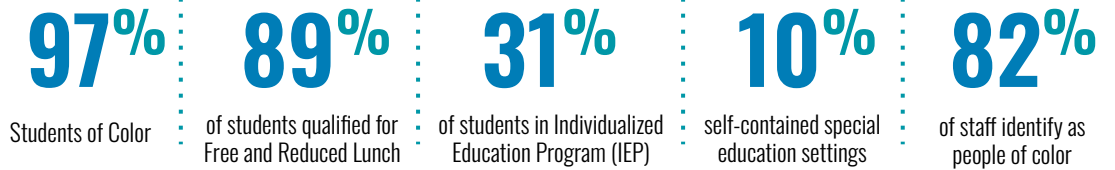

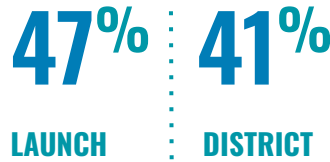
