COMMUNITY AND SCHOOLS

Clarkstown Central School District is located in a largely residential suburban community in Rockland County, 25 miles from New York City. There are two high schools (North and South) comprised of grades 9-12. Both high schools have been accredited by the New York State Department of Education and the Middle States Association. The district's reputation and commitment to academic excellence has been noted since its establishment in 1949.

FACULTY AND SERVICES

North High School is staffed by a principal, three assistant principals, school counselors, psychologists, student assistance counselors, nurses, speech therapists, school resource officers and librarians. In addition to the regular classroom staff, the district provides a full range of special educational services from academic assistance and resource rooms to self-contained programs.

GRADING SYSTEM

Clarkstown uses a numeric grading system, (0-100%), in which 65.00 is the lowest passing grade. GPA is based on all completed high school courses. Only Honors, IB & AP classes are weighted. Final Course grades appearing on the transcript are unweighted; only the cumulative GPA is weighted.
