Procedure for Handling Complaints of Discrimination

Any person alleging discrimination based on race, color, national origin, sex, age, or disability has a right to file a complaint. All complaints, written or verbal, shall be accepted. The SFA Procedure will be as follows:

- Any person that approaches Child Nutrition Program staff and claims they have been
 discriminated against should be encouraged to complete the Discrimination Complaint Form. A
 member of the Child Nutrition Program can assist with the process. If the person chooses not to
 complete the form, the staff assisting the person may take the information verbally and
 complete this form. That person will identify themselves on the complaint form as the person
 who transcribed the complaint.
- The Food & Nutrition (F&N) Complaint Link is provided for persons wishing to file a complaint with F&N at the Texas Department of Agriculture. This Link is available in English and Spanish at htps://squaremeals.org/About/Contact Food Nutrition.aspx For assistance with the complaint process, or if you do not have access to an electronic device to submit your complaint, please call us at (833) 862-7499 and someone will assist you.
- The Discrimination Complaint Form, once completed or completed as best as possible, is forwarded to Marco Macias, Child Nutrition, School Food Authority at mamacias@canutillo-isd.org
- The School Food Authority Liaison forwards the Discrimination Complaint Form to the Texas Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Division, Compliance Department. The Contracting Entity will not attempt to resolve the complaint without forwarding the complaint to TDA.

The letter must contain the complainant's name, address, telephone number, and a written description of the alleged discriminatory action in sufficient detail to inform the Assistant Secretary for Civil Rights (ASCR) about the nature and date of an alleged civil rights violation.
