# VI. Special Presentation: Student Internships / Student Career Partnerships

The Citizens Advisory Committee team presented their findings from the Student Internships / Student Career Partnerships study. Committee members Amanda Pyzoha, Joe Brinkman, and Allison Dupee began by identify the objectives which included identifying best practices for developing a high school program, what resources are available, what are the scheduling structures, and how do we maximize our support. Mr. Brinkman reviewed terms and assumptions and Ms. Dupee and Ms. Pyzoha reviewed best practices and program models from their research along with obstacles to successful programs. Final recommendations included identifying target student population, mobilizing resources and engaging with strategic community organizations such as local Business Advisory Councils. Mrs. Broderick asked about the example shared from Madeira City Schools and Ms. Pyzoha responded that their model is an Entrepreneurship Course. Ms. Pyzoha shared that they found that the most robust programs had a

dedicated staff member with at least 50% of their day dedicated to this effort. Mr. Feldmeier asked if the group had a specific recommendation to how students were selected and Ms. Pyzoha shared that starting with staff discussions would be a good first step.

#### VII. Policy Review Discussion: Bylaws 0121 through 0141.2

Mrs. Zoller led a review of the BOE Bylaws 0121 through 0141.2. Several technical corrections were discussed and Board members agreed to keep a list of all changes to be brought back to the board at one time for approval.
