The BCS Preschool staff has been working hard to implement a new "First Things First" curriculum designed to promote age-appropriate social skills based on the scriptural Fruits of the Spirit. Each month a new "fruit" characteristic is introduced and discussed at chapel and during Bible. The children practice each fruit as they dive into its meaning and what it looks like in connection to living a life like Jesus. Students who display this trait are recognized at chapel with a medal and certificate, and their names are displayed in the hallway on our Fruits of the Spirit tree. Students and staff have also put their dancing and singing skills to work as they have learned a catchy new Fruit of the Spirit song together.

Preschool Teacher Spotlight- Reese Hernandez & Gail Dickerson

The Preschool program (ages 3-4 years old) at BCS is all about teaching children to love learning and helping each child grow spiritually, academically and socially. At the heart of the program are the two lead teachers who invest so much of themselves into a job that both view as a higher calling. Gail Dickerson and Reese Hernandez combine diverse backgrounds and a common love for Christian education to create a welcoming learning environment for our youngest Panthers. They aim to prepare students for kindergarten by teaching letters and numbers while also helping to build their faith through Bible stories, songs and character development. "Gail and Reese make an excellent team," said Preschool Director Lori Yoder. "I am always amazed by the creativity they bring to their jobs and the incredible love and patience they have for their students. They know how to inspire children and to infuse learning into everyday things. I love to hear their classrooms filled with singing and the contented hum of children busily engaged in learning."

Gail Dickerson has been a part of the BCS family for five years. Her interest in preschool peaked years ago when she was a volunteer in her own sons' classroom. After earning her certification, she went on to teach preschool for 28 years, including 14 years in VPK. Her enthusiasm for her work is still going strong. "I love the expression on kids' faces when they understand what I'm teaching them - when they have that 'a-ha! moment' and get very excited," she said.


Reese Hernandez is finishing her second year at BCS. Originally from Ohio, she has a Master of Education degree and a bachelor's in Elementary Education K-6. Her 18 years of teaching experience includes kindergarten, second and third grade with nine years in the public education system. "Having been in public schools, I can see how much more we are able to offer to our students here. I notice a big difference even with my own daughters (first and fourth grade BCS students) and I'm so grateful for the school/church/home partnership. I love to be a part of that Christian influence for my students and help them to reach their fullest potential in school and in their walk with Jesus."

Thanks to Gail and Reese and all the staff, our Preschool at BCS is thriving and in high demand. The hallways are perpetually lined with colorful artwork, and the sounds of learning and laughter are everywhere. Children arrive each morning, excited for another day of school, and often can be heard as they leave in the afternoon telling their parents about all the fun things they did that day. And that is when the teachers know it was another day well spent.


Dr. Seuss Week introduces children to his fun and engaging books and allows them time to practice sight words, story time, rhyming and other early literacy skills.


Grandparents Day is Always Extra Special
