Students living outside of district boundaries and families who wish to attend a school other than their neighborhood school, must complete the school choice application. Where space is limited, priority enrollment is given to in-district students.

About Personalized Learning in Your Child's School

Did you know? Your child's school uses a Competency Based System (CBS) to help teachers customize the way your child learns, according to his or her strengths and challenges. CBS enables all students to:


- Learn at a customized pace—progressing quickly in strength areas, and receiving extra help from teachers in areas of challenge
- Master knowledge and skills—demonstrating confidence and ability in one area of knowledge and skills before moving on to the next
- Real-time student information—at any time, parents and teachers can go online to see where a student is excelling and where they need additional time and extra help in order to grow

Meet Luz



TRADITIONAL GRADE LEVEL: 4th Grade


Luz is 9 years old, and in a traditional school she'd be in fourth grade. Since Luz is great at math, she is already working in Math Level 5, which is above-average. Literacy is a challenge area, so Luz is getting extra help from teachers as she works in Literacy Level 3. She's right on track in Science and Social Studies.



How Personalized Learning Works

The Westminster Public Schools Competency Based System (CBS) presents knowledge and skills as a series of blocks that build up on each other. Students show that they have mastered one block—called a **learning target**—before moving on to the next. Within each content area, there is a collection of learning targets that make up a **performance level**. Students complete all of the learning targets within one performance level before moving on to the next level.

To graduate, students complete 12 performance levels in each content area.



Learning Targets

Traditional Approach:

All students move through the same content at the teacher's pace.

Personalized Approach:

Students learn at a customized pace, mastering groups of knowledge and skills called learning targets. To complete a learning target, students must earn a score of 3 or better on a 4-point scale. A variety of learning targets make up each performance level.

Example:

Math Level 2 includes ten learning targets. A student must earn a score of 3 or better to complete each learning target; they must complete all targets to move on to the next performance level.

Performance Levels

Traditional Approach:

Students are placed in one grade level according to their age, for the entire year for all subjects.

Personalized Approach:

Students work in a performance level in each core content area according to their demonstrated abilities.

Example:

A typical fourth-grader may work in Math Level 5, Literacy Level 3, Social Studies Level 4 and Science Level 4. This would mean that math is a strength area and literacy is a challenge area.

HELPFUL TERMS:

Learning Target:

A group of knowledge and skills that students master.

Proficiency:

Is demonstrated when a student scores 3 or better on a 4-point scale, which must happen in order to complete a learning target.

Performance Level:

A collection of learning targets in each content area. Students move on to the next performance level when they demonstrate proficiency in all of its learning targets.

Student Proficiency

Traditional Approach:

Students move up one grade level in all subjects each year, regardless of their ability in each subject.

Personalized Approach:

Students learn at a customized pace. They move from one performance level to the next when they have demonstrated proficiency in all of the learning targets that comprise that level. Students complete Level 12 in all subjects to graduate.

Example:

A student may complete all of the learning targets in Literacy Level 3, and move on to Literacy Level 4, during the middle of the school year. Or, he may start a new school year continuing his work from the previous year on learning targets in Math Level 2.

REGISTER WITH WPS

Enroll in the preschool program of your choice using the Westminster Public Schools Online Registration. All applications will be reviewed by the ECE department. Families will receive tentative placement within 4-6 weeks.





APPLY WITH COLORADO UNIVERSAL PRESCHOOL

Once you receive tentative placement, you will be contacted by WPS to finish your registration with the State of Colorado. All parents and caregivers, regardless of income, county or school district, MUST APPLY for a Preschool spot (3 and 4 year olds) using the Universal Preschool portal for the state of Colorado, which does not open until early 2024. Registered Pre-K families with WPS will receive notice when the portal opens.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- 4-year-olds* are eligible for free full day preschool, Monday-Friday
- 3-year-olds* are eligible for free ½ day programming.
 - *Age based on Oct. 1st cut off date
- If you need more hours than allotted by the state, WPS may be able to provide additional hours at no additional cost to you.
- If your child is not yet 3 years old by Oct. 1st, they may apply for a spot at our tuition-based Early Learning Center, F.M. Day, which accepts children from 3 months old.
- Spots are limited. Enrollment priority will be granted to families living inside our district borders before opening spots up to other families.

WESTY JUNIORS

The Westy Juniors program is the first of its kind in the metro area offering athletic team sports to elementary student-athletes through their public schools. A school-based program allows students to play on teams with their classmates while parents connect with each other in after school games and practices.

ADDRESSING NON-ACADEMIC BARRIERS TO STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

DANIEL C. VALLEZ FAMILY EDUCATION CENTER

Westminster Public Schools will be opening a new facility to provide valuable resources to the community in the area of 71st and Pecos. Named after WPS educator Daniel C. Vallez, the Family Education Center will serve WPS students and their families by providing access to essential learning materials along with language and health care support. After a remodeling project, the Daniel C. Vallez Family Education Center will replace the Perl Mack Community Center at 7125 Mariposa Street. MENTAL HEALTH

Westminster Public Schools recognizes that kids today are facing more stress than ever- from adjustments during the pandemic, family disruption, peer-pressure and bullying, to anxiety around graduation and post-secondary options. WPS has systems in place to keep kids safe and healthy. Each school has a counselor or mental health interventionist on-site and we partner with organizations like Safe2Tell and Community Reach who use trauma responsive practices. WHS even has a trained therapy dog. WPS was also just awarded a 1.5 million dollar grant to expand our support for student mental health initiatives. NUTRITION

Westminster Public Schools is committed to providing the nutrients students need for growth, development, learning and overall health, especially for our most vulnerable children and adolescents. School breakfast and lunch are provided at no cost to families, resulting in positive impacts on mental health, including reductions in behavioral problems, anxiety and depression. Studies show that students who receive school breakfast have improved attendance, behavior, academic performance and academic achievement as well as decreased tardiness.

Beginning July 1, all families, regardless of income, are encouraged to fill out a meal appliction- which helps your family and school receive benefits like discounts on home internet, school fees, scholarships to after-school programs and funding for more support staff in schools.



TRANSPORTATION

Westminster Public Schools provides free bus service for all in-district students who live more than one mile from their assigned neighborhood elementary school and more than a mile and a half from their assigned middle or high school.

WPS also provides free transportation for students who attend one of the choice PK-8 schools on the south side of the district: Colorado Sports Leadership Academy, Josephine Hodgkins Leadership Academy, Orchard Park Academy or Tennyson Knolls Preparatory School. In general, students will depart from an assigned bus stop with the bus circulating to all of the schools. Free bus service is also available to students with an Individual Education Plan (IEP) with transportation as a related service. All students using transportation service are required to have a Westminster Public Schools ID card in their possession while riding a bus.

Future Plan

It's the way students learn about who they are, what kind of life they want, and how to get there! Includes preparation for careers and college.



Beginning in 6th grade, talk with your child about his or her Future Plan at the start of each semester.

What it Takes to Graduate

Along with a Future Plan that shows they are ready to pursue a career after high school, students will complete core classes, electives and a "readiness benchmark."



Starting in the 6th grade, read and understand the new graduation requirements so that you can help your child graduate on time.

The Test that Opens Doors: SAT

The SAT is a test that helps determine where students can enroll in college, what financial assistance they may earn, or what path they take in the military. The PSAT is a practice test that helps your child prepare for the SAT.

A strong SAT score can help students show they're ready for a job; qualify for scholarships at technical, two-year, and four-year colleges; get accepted at more colleges and universities; test out of college classes; and have more choices in the military.



Starting in 8th grade, make sure your child practices for the SAT for 45 minutes each week!

Careers and College Start

in High School

Students can explore careers and college coursework while they're still in high school! Many FREE programs can help them earn tuition-free college credit and gain hands-on work experience. Saving them time and money after high school, no matter what their plans are!



Beginning in 8th grade, visit us online or in the Future Center, or meet with your child's counselor, to learn more and encourage your child to apply for one or more of these programs!



There is Help to Pay for College

There are two types of help — "financial aid" is based on your family's income, and "scholarships" are largely based on what your student accomplishes in high school

Financial aid includes loans, grants and work study. It's first-come, first-served, so the earlier you apply, the better! Scholarships are up to your student: working hard in school can mean receiving FREE money for college that doesn't have to be paid back!



Beginning in 9th grade, start exploring scholarships. Attend a financial-aid workshop in the fall of 12th grade. Apply for financial aid, ideally by December 1 of 12th grade.

- Technical School Earn a certificate or credential and prepare for a specific career
