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Expanded Choice Explained

In Richland School District Two, students are assigned to a school according to their residential address. Expanded Choice is a program that allows Richland School District Two families to apply to attend another district school other than their residentially zoned school without applying for a specific program such as a magnet program. Selection of students wishing to attend a school other than their zoned school is based upon school capacity and determined through lottery.

Important Points to Remember

- You must reside in Richland School District Two to apply for any Richland Two Choice program
- Parents/Guardians must provide transportation for all choice options
- Each school in Richland School District Two is either a Schoolwide Magnet (aka Schoolwide Magnet) or an Expanded Choice School. Expanded Choice and all Schoolwide Magnets applications submitted within the required time frame become part of a computerized random selection process.
- Each year, based on the expected enrollment and capacity of each school, the district decides which schools will be open to Expanded Choice or Schoolwide Magnets.

Frequently Asked Questions About Expanded Choice Programs

What is the Expanded Choice Program?

In Richland School District Two, students are assigned to a school according to their residential address. Expanded Choice is a program that allows Richland School District Two families to apply to attend another district school other than their residentially zoned school.

Are there schools closed to Expanded Choice?

Each year, based on the expected enrollment and capacity of each school, the district decides which schools will be open to Expanded Choice. View the Closed to Choice list on the Richland Two website.

Who is eligible to apply?

To apply for Expanded Choice, students must reside within Richland School District Two. Students who are currently in kindergarten through 11th grade may apply for Expanded Choice. In addition, students who will begin kindergarten in the upcoming year may apply. Preschool age (ages three and four) students are not eligible to use Expanded Choice to choice into a preschool program. The CFCD (Center for Child Development) handles all pre-K applications and enrollments. Students who are 3 and 4 years old (must be 3/4 on or before September 1st of the school year applying) are able to apply for the Montessori Magnet program.

Can a student with an Individualized Education Program (IEP) apply for Expanded Choice?

Students receiving special education may apply for choice to a magnet school, magnet program, virtual school, or another school within the district through the Choice program. During application periods, parents/guardians apply online and follow the district's school choice process. The decision to grant the choice request is based on the student's programming needs and program capacity at the school of choice. Richland Two adheres to state special education program capacity guidelines. Once a student is granted choice, all district transportation rules apply and the student is no longer eligible to receive district transportation, including Special Needs Transportation to and from school. Parents/guardians are responsible for transportation to their school of choice.

When and how can I apply?

Applications must be submitted online during the application period. Choice 1 begins in November and Choice 2 begins in April. The application is for the upcoming school year. Out-of-district students may not apply for Expanded Choice.

May students apply to both a Magnet program and Expanded Choice?

Each student may apply for up to three programs which can include a combination of magnets and Expanded Choice. However, a student may receive approval for only one Choice program. Students will need to prioritize their selections. If approved for their first priority, they no longer have the option to attend another selection(s).

How are applicants selected?

Parents may submit an electronic application during the application period in November-December. This application is for the following school year.

How many applicants are selected for each school?

Parents may submit an electronic application during the application period for Choice I in November-December and Choice II in April. This application period is for the following school year.

How will families find out about their selection status?

During the initial registration for the online application, each family will create a username and password that will need to be saved. During the accept/decline period, parents must log onto this website using the same username and password to see if students are selected to attend a Choice School.

If students are granted attendance to a school through Expanded Choice, can they opt to go back to their zoned school after the start of school?

A student may always return to their residentially zoned school. If a Choice student decides to withdraw and attend his/her zoned school or moves out of the district, then the student's Choice status is terminated. However, students are expected to remain at the Choice school until they move to the next level (for example,

elementary to middle, middle to high), at which time they may apply for another Choice.

Once a student is granted attendance to a school through Expanded Choice, can they lose the option to attend that school?

Expanded Choice is a program for students who reside in Richland School District Two. If a student moves outside of the district, the student can no longer attend any Richland School District Two school. Additionally, any student attending a school through Expanded Choice must maintain the following: • Exemplary punctuality and attendance at school • Cooperation with the school in regards to academic, discipline, and safety expectations • Transportation to and from school

Who provides transportation?

Parents whose children participate in any of the district's Expanded Choice or magnet programs must provide transportation for their children to and from school. The inability of a student to meet the attendance expectations of the Choice school will lead to Choice being revoked. In that case, the student must then return to the zoned school.

How does Expanded Choice affect participation in interscholastic athletics and school activities?

The rules of the South Carolina High School League determine eligibility for interscholastic athletics and activities for middle and high school students. It is the parents' and students' responsibility to be aware of these athletic procedures before applying for a Choice option. Any student who accepts a Choice program and participates in an athletic activity at the Choice school during the spring or summer (cheerleading tryouts, spring football practice, summer team camps) may have their eligibility affected. If you have questions regarding Choice and participation in interscholastic athletics, please contact your school's athletic director prior to applying for a Choice program or a transfer to a school other than your zoned school. Additionally, many eligibility concerns are addressed in the athletics frequently asked questions.

What is a Sibling Transfer and how is it used?

A Sibling Transfer is a transfer granted for a student when the student's sibling (living in the same household) is attending or will attend the requested school during the same year through an approved District transfer. The sibling transfer may be used to allow the requesting sibling to transfer into a school without participating in Choice or transfer into a school when one student is selected for a transfer through Choice and the other sibling is not. A parent may apply for this transfer by completing a Sibling Request Form. Once a student is granted a sibling transfer, the student may remain at the school for the remainder of that level (Elem. Middle, High) as long as the student's parent/guardian continues to reside in Richland Two. If one sibling is approved through Expanded Choice or for a Schoolwide Magnet school, the other sibling can be approved to attend the same school utilizing the Sibling Transfer process. The Sibling Transfer cannot be approved to allow admittance into a School within a School Magnet Program, a Magnet Center or the eSchool. Due to Pre-K not being a mandated grade and not able to participate in the Choice process, Pre-k students are not allowed to receive a Sibling Transfer unless they are selected for the Montessori Program.

If approved for Choice, does the student need to apply each year?

If approved for a Richland School District Two School Choice program, a student does not need to apply yearly for the same program. Choice approvals are valid for the duration of a student's stay at the approved school until they change schools or move out of Richland School District Two. There are circumstances that will cause a student to have their Choice revoked pertaining to poor attendance, lack of cooperation with the school and academic performance in programs (magnets, AVID) that require maintenance of academic standards.
