1: EGG RACE TIC TAC TOE

Classes will be divided into 4 teams, with 2 teams at each tic tac toe setup.

Each team is trying to get a row of three matching eggs before their opponents.

Team A will send person 1, then Team B will send person 1, then A2, B2, A3, ...

A student will carry an egg on a spoon to the tic tac toe board and place it. If they drop the egg along the way, they must do 5 jumping jacks before picking the egg up and resuming.

First team to get 3 in a row wins!





2: BABY CHICK TOSS

Students will be paired up with teammates.

Each teammate will wear a basketball hoop headband and receive 8 chicks.

Students will take turns tossing chicks into their teammates hoop.

Chicks that fall on the ground must be picked up and re-tossed.





3: PUZZLE EGG RELAY

Teams will be set up around the central "ball pit" pool, 4-5 students per team.

One at a time, the students run to the pool and find an egg with a puzzle inside, then take it back to their team cone. The next student may then run to the pool and get an egg.

When all teammates have their eggs: they will open them, sort their puzzle pieces and figure out which puzzles they have.

One at a time, teammates must run to the puzzle bases, retrieve the correct base and go back to their cone to assemble their puzzle. The next teammate may then run to find the correct base.


How many puzzles can each team complete before time runs out?

How many times can your whole class make it through the course?






5: BUNNY HOP TAG

Mosaic Health Dental Service

On Monday, all DPS students (3PK to 2nd grade) will bring home a registration form from Mosaic Health. Below are details about the dental service available.

School-Based Dental Program Coming to your Student's School!!!!



Welcome

Your school district/Head Start program offers an inschool portable preventative dental health program through Mosaic Health for students enrolled in participating eligible schools.

What is the School-Based Dental Program?

The portable dental program operates within the school building while the school is in session, utilizing portable dental equipment that is easily set-up and broken down. We visit the school yearly for a limited amount of time based on student enrollment.

What Services are Offered?

Preventative services offered include screenings, exams, dental x-rays, intra-oral photos, cleanings, exams, dental x-rays, intra-oral photos, cleanings, fluoride treatments, and sealants. Additionally, ageappropriate dental education is provided in classroom sessions or virtually by video presentations. Services are provided by a New York State licensed Dental Hygienist and Dentist from Mosaic Health.

What does it cost?

No child will be denied services due to inability to pay, please call for assistance.

Mosaic Health will bill your student's dental insurance carrier directly for services. Most insurances cover preventative services at 100%.

Who is Eligible for the Program?

All students may receive preventative dental care. If you have a family dentist, your student can still get preventative care at school. We will send a letter about the services your student receives to their family dentist and provide a copy of their x-rays/intra-oral photos when requested by their dentist.

How do I Enroll My Student?

Please complete the attached **Dental Enrollment Form** and return to your student's school.

How are Appointments Scheduled?

Once enrollment forms have been collected and registered into the program, we will set up and start seeing students. Your student will be called down to the dental services area for their appointment which takes 20-30 minutes typically. We always try to avoid a core subject or special activity when providing services.

After the visit your student will receive a goody bag filled with oral hygiene supplies, and a letter discussing the outcome of the appointment. If there are areas of concern, a phone call to the student's home will be made.

Can I come to my student's appointment?

Parents are welcome to come, **but it is not necessary**. There is a spot on the enrollment form where you can indicate you would like to attend. We will do our best to accommodate.

Mosaic Health values the oral health of the children in our community. Our school-based portable dental program that is offered to every child enrolled at participating Schools and Head Start programs.

Each student who enrolls receives a dental screening, toothbrush, floss, and toothpaste. Our dentist and dental hygienist will also teach your child how to floss and brush their teeth the right way, what snacks are healthiest, and how plaque and the decay process happen.

Is my child eligible for this program?

Every child enrolled in a participating school is entitled to receive these services and education. We welcome patients with major/private insurances as well as: Medicaid, Medicaid Managed Care Plans, Child Health Plus and many more. If you do not have insurance you may qualify for our sliding fee discount program based on your household income and size.

What services do we provide?

- Dental Cleanings
- Dental Exams
- Dental Radiographs
- Dental Screenings
- Dental Sealants
 Fluoride Treatments

How do I sign my child up?

Each school year a dental registration packet will go home with every student. If you would like your child to participate in the program the packet should be completed and returned as soon as possible. Please be on the lookout for the registration packet during the 2019-2020 school year.

What if my child needs follow-up care?

If your child needs follow-up dental care and you do not already have a dentist, we will send a referral list home and your child is welcome to become a patient at a Mosaic Health office. In fact, we can treat your entire family for all of your dental needs!

Vision and Hearing Screenings

FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

The district's School Health Services program supports your student's academic success by promoting health in the school setting. One way that we provide care for your student is by performing the health screenings as mandated by the State of New York.

During this school year, the following screenings will be required or completed at school:

Vision

- Distance and near acuity for all newly entering students and students in Pre-K or Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, and 11.
- · Color perception screening for all newly entering students.

Hearina

 Hearing screening for all newly entering students and students in Pre-K or Kindergarten, Grades 1, 3, 5, 7, and 11.

Scoliosis

 Scoliosis (spinal curvature) screening for all girls in grades 5 and 7, and boys in grade 9.

A letter will be sent home if your student needs follow-up with your healthcare provider. Please call the Health Office directly if you have any questions or concerns.

Arrival and Dismissal

Arrival

All **4PK-2nd grade students** will enter at the main entrance of school and must be to school by 8:00.

- Students can be dropped off as early as 7:15.
- Breakfast will be served from 7:30-8:10.
- Buses unload students at 7:40.

All 3PK students will enter at the side door at 9:00 for the AM program or 12:30 for the PM program.

Dismissal

Dismissal changes must be made *before 1:00pm*. Parent pick-up will begin at 2:15pm each day at the following doors based on last name. Please make sure we have the name of the person picking up and that person has a *driver's license for identification*.

- A-C at the ELC doorway on the parking lot side
- D-H at the back playground door
- I-Q at the first door on the left in the driveway between the HS & PS
- R-Z at the second door on the left in the driveway between the HS & PS

All 3PK AM and PM students will exit at the side door at 11:30 for the AM program and 3:00 for the PM program. Our 3PK students are dropped off and picked up in the small Primary Bus Loop during the following times: 8:45-9:00, 11:20-11:35, 12:20-12:30, and 2:50-3:05. Please consider parking in a different location so that you aren't trapped in the loop.


