EASTER SUNDAY MARCH 31, 2024

From Fr. Eric: Mary of Magdala finds that the stone has been removed from Jesus' tomb.

Today we begin the Easter Season, our 50-day meditation on the mystery of Christ's Resurrection. Our Gospel today tells us about the disciples' discovery of the empty tomb. It concludes by telling us that they did not yet understand that Jesus had risen from the dead. Thus, the details provided are not necessarily meant to offer proof of the Resurrection. The details invite us to reflect upon **a most amazing gift, that is faith in Jesus and his Resurrection.**

Our faith in the resurrection of Jesus is based on two things – the witness of the empty tomb and of those to whom Jesus revealed himself after his resurrection. These were the privileged few whom he mandated to preach to the people that he has been appointed judge of the living and the dead. **The celebration of Easter is therefore an affirmation of our faith in the witness of those who were privileged to see Jesus after his resurrection from the dead.** If we focus only on the empty tomb, we would be left with the question of knowing what happened to his body. We risk partaking in the speculation that his body might have been stolen by his disciples if we do not turn our eyes to the witnesses of the resurrection appearances of Jesus. Again, we also risk missing the most important truth that should occupy our minds.

It becomes evident that Easter day is not simply a day to rejoice and proclaim that Christ is risen from the dead. It is not simply a day to prolong the chanting of Alleluia in praise of the God who has done marvels for us. **Easter day is a call to reflect deeply on this great event of Christian history.** It is a time to probe the Scriptures to discover the truth to which we need to cling if Easter is to make sense to us and to contemporary society. It is only through the declarations of the eye witnesses of the risen Lord that we discover the key to the proclamation of the good news of the resurrection. **Easter is therefore a call to return to the Scriptures and discover God right where he revealed himself – in his word, because he is the WORD MADE FLESH.**

The Gospel passage concludes, however, that even having seen the empty tomb and the burial cloths, the disciples do not yet understand about the Resurrection. In the passage that follows, Mary of Magdala meets Jesus but mistakes him for the gardener. In the weeks ahead, the Gospel readings from our liturgy will show us how the disciples came to believe in Jesus' Resurrection through his appearances to them. **Our Easter faith is based on their witness to both the empty tomb and their continuing relationship with Jesus**—in his appearances and in his gift of the Holy Spirit.

Quick lesson: Christ has commissioned us to preach to the people and testify that he is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead (Acts 10:42).

EASTER SUNDAY: Today as we celebrate the feast of Easter we find the challenge of also seeing and believing the resurrection that comes through our own lives of self-sacrifice which brings new life to others. **As you place your gift in the Society of St. Vincent de Paul Poor Box, know that you are a sign of God's love to those who are suffering and you give them Easter hope and joy.**




