Passover begins at sundown on April 22 and ends the evening of April 30

Passover is a festival of freedom. It commemorates the Israelites' Exodus from Egypt. The main ritual of Passover is the Seder, which occurs on the first of two nights (in Israel just the first night) of the holiday — a festive meal that involves the re-telling of the Exodus through stories and song and the consumption of ritual foods, including matzah and maror (bitter herbs).
