HISTORY

Archbishop Spalding was established in 1963 by the Archdiocese of Baltimore as an all-girls high school called Holy Trinity High School. When the school moved to its present location in 1966, it was renamed Martin Spalding High School in honor of the seventh archbishop of Baltimore. Its name was changed to Archbishop Spalding High School in 1986. The school has been coeducational since 1973.

In May 2003, the school acquired the adjacent 22-acre Upton Farm property, enlarging the school's campus to 52 acres. The addition of a new arts and technology wing was completed in September 2009. Today, the campus boasts 50 academic classrooms and four science laboratories. The school also has a MAC laboratory and a Project Lead the Way Engineering program. The auditorium, with 1,200 seats, provides a location for school-wide assemblies and liturgies as well as theater and music productions. A new auditorium was built in 2017, allowing for more space. The school has seven athletic fields along with a main gymnasium seating 1,100 and a secondary gymnasium seating 500. In 2021, Spalding completed a \$7 million campaign which resulted in a state-of-the-art innovation center which houses the school's engineering and cybersecurity programs as well as the Edward St. John Foundation MakerSpace.

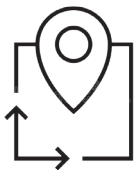

POSITION OVERVIEW

The Vice President of Advancement is a 12-month, full-time administrator responsible to the President. The Vice President of Advancement is responsible for managing and leading an energetic team; possesses a firm foundational knowledge of the role to realize success; and is experienced in major gift giving for schools. This person will be excited to lead the school's development program, including the Spalding Fund, major and planned giving, alumni relations, advancement events, and capital campaigns that are designed to raise support and funds for operating costs, building repairs and improvements, financial aid, school endowments, and other special purposes.

Primary duties include but are not limited to:

- Supervise all staff in the Advancement Department: Assistant Director of Institutional Advancement, Director of Alumni Engagement, Advancement Assistant and Database Manager
- Serve as Archbishop Spalding's chief fundraiser
- Develop and manage all fundraising campaigns, including annual giving, restricted and planned giving, and capital campaigns
- Provide vision and oversight for –
 - » All annual appeals
 - » Major gifts work
 - » Advancement events
 - » Foundation relations/grants
 - » Capital campaigns
 - » Alumni and parent engagement
 - » Stewardship of constituents and donors
 - » Maintenance of a comprehensive donor/constituent database
- Serve as liaison to the Board Advancement Committee
- Attend School Board meetings
- Serve as member of the President's Council
- Develop marketing programs and publications that support development, in conjunction with the Director of Marketing & Communications Lead planning for the department and assure that the plan is achieved
- Create and oversee the Advancement budget
- Help coordinate all other outside fundraising activities originating in other school organizations (e.g., Alumni Association, Parents' Association, Booster Club, and Friends of the Arts)
- Perform other administrative duties pertaining to her/his position as may be assigned by the President.
