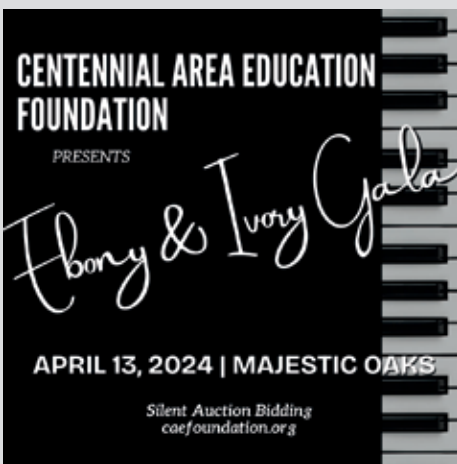

### NEW MATH CURRICULUM!

Students in kindergarten through fifth grade are learning math via a new curriculum called Math Expressions. The five pillars of Math Expressions are helping community, building concepts, math talk, quick practice, and student leaders. Mastering math starts with knowing the numbers. It's also about looking beyond numbers to understand how and why they work, and learning to ask the questions that lead to a thoughtful, informed approach to solving problems.

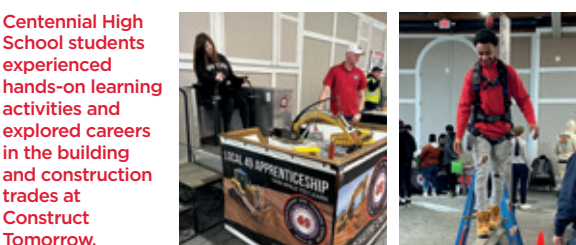
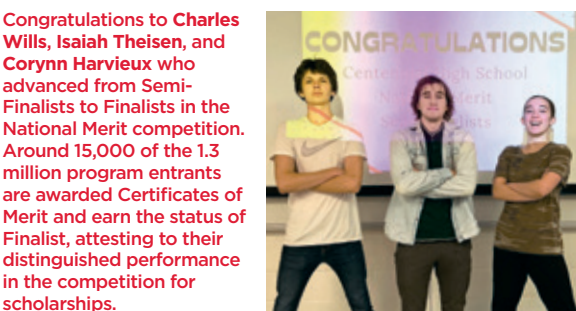

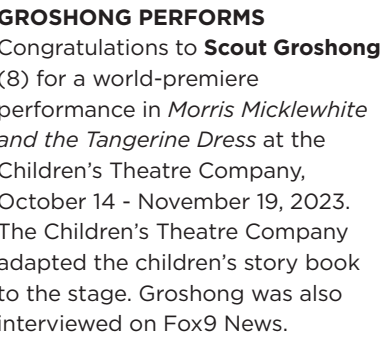
**MOLINARES WINS ON THE ICE**

The Centennial School Board met with state legislators **Sen. Michael Kreun**, **Sen. Heather Gustafson**, and **Rep. Elliot Engren** at the District's Legislative Breakfast held in January. We continue to make our case for equalization in funding formulas from fair equalization and the expansion of allowable uses for facility needs, to the impact of free or reduced-price lunch on the funding formula and the need to fully fund mandates from last year's session.
