# **Easter Light**

ne of my favorite forms of painting has been mastered by three artists from different countries: Georges de la Tour of France, Rembrandt of Holland, and Caravaggio from Italy. In French, the style is *clair/obscur*, in Italian, *ciarro/oscuro* and in English, light/darkness. My apologies to the Dutch for not knowing the Dutch equivalent.

I think light and darkness are such appropriate and important themes for us at Easter. Jesus came into a world of darkness to be its light. In John's gospel, he tells us, but we preferred darkness. **The good news is that God does not allow darkness to win.** Even though this holy week is filled with the darkness of deception, false accusations, betrayal, denial, abandonment, great suffering, pain, and death and Jesus' own feelings of abandonment, even by his own Father, He remains faithful to tell us that light, love and life are victorious. They ultimately win is the Easter message.

As we have traveled through Holy Week and prepared for Easter, let us look at our own dark moments: maybe of sadness and fear, perhaps anxiety, maybe physical or emotional suffering and pain, perhaps abandonment, or betrayal or denial, any, and all of the darkness that can exist in this world.

Let us light a candle, or some candles, and turn off the lights to remind ourselves, that the light of Christ pierced through the darkness and continues to do that even in the midst of the darker moments of life. We know the end of the story, and that is a good ending. The ending of our story is that love and life win; light pervades over darkness, and we are called to be that light in our world. Happy Easter! Life, love, Easter win and not to let darkness take that victory from you.

You'll also learn about the life of the artist Constantino Brumido, whose famous paintings are in the building. # OLGC Spring Book Study: The Practice of the Presence of God

Our OLGC book study is back beginning Wednesday, April 10. This 5-week session will have us spend some time with Carmelite Br. Lawrence in The Practice of the Presence of God.



Through his conversa-

tions, letters, and maxims of how we should live, Br. Lawrence emphasizes the need to cultivate a sense of the presence of God in our soul and in our world.

# 'Ecumenical Future' Symposium to Honor Fr. John Crossin

The Washington Theological Consortium will host a symposium and panel discussion on "The Ecumenical Future," that honors the legacy of Oblate Father John Crossin, OSFS (1947–2023), on April 18 in Washington, D.C.





Father Crossin, a priest with the Oblates of St. Francis de Sales and a national leader in ecumenical dialogue, died of cancer May 12, 2023, shortly after the publication of his latest book, *Moving into the Ecumenical Future: Foundations of a Paradigm for Christian Ethics*.

He ministered for many years in the Washington Metropolitan area.

The symposium will take place from 6:30 to 9 p.m. at the Ukrainian Catholic National Shrine, 4250 Harewood Rd NE, Washington, D.C., after an Eastern Christian prayer service at 6:30 p.m. A Q&A session and reception, with reflections on Father Crossin's legacy, will follow the panel discussion.

Panelists for the symposium will be Dr. Timothy Sedgwick, Professor Emeritus of Christian Ethics at Virginia Theological Seminary (Episcopalian); Oblate Father Donald J. Heet, OSFS, Parochial Vicar of St. John Neumann Catholic Church in Reston, Dr. Beverly Goines, Assistant Teaching Professor at Georgetown University, (Disciples of Christ), and Kathy Hope Brown, D.Min, Director of Pastoral Care at the Saint Luke Institute (Silver Spring, MD).

The symposium is open to the public. Register on the WTC website (washtheocon.org). The symposium will be livestreamed; the video will be available following the event.

Since Father Crossin's passing, his family, together with his Oblate brothers and ecumenical colleagues, have joined together to honor his life's work. They have established the Crossin-Oblate Family Partnership. "This partnership works to continue the ecumenical dialogue to which John dedicated his life. I can think of no more appropriate way to honor John's lifelong commitment to uniting people through faith," said Father Jack Kolodziej, OSFS, Provincial, Wilmington-Philadelphia Province. This symposium is one of many efforts the partnership has supported in Father Crossin's legacy.






