




How will these resources help me to help my child?


Parents will access SBAC parent resources in order to become familiar with testing processes, protocols, and access test questions to support their child.



General SBAC Information



Every year, California students take several statewide tests. When combined with other measures such as grades, class work, and teacher observations, these tests give families and teachers a complete picture of their child's learning. Parents can use the results to identify where their child is doing well and where they might need more support.

Smarter Balanced summative assessments (SBAC) in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics	Grades 3 through 8 and 11	Administered April - May
The science assessment is the California Science Test (CAST), which is based on the Next Generation Science Standards.	Grades 5, 8, and once in high school. At NLMUSD, we administer it in 11th Grade	Administered March - May
Summative English Language Proficiency Assessment for California (ELPAC)	Administered to students who are classified as English Learner Students who are in TK-12.	Administered February 1 - May 31



Assessment Student Supports

The California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) and English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC) provide a full range of assessment resources for all students, including those who are English learners and students with disabilities. These resources ensure that the assessments meet the needs of all students.

Some resources are embedded into the technology platform for the computer-administered CAASPP and ELPAC tests.

The following list defines the four different categories of student accessibility resources:

- **Universal tools** are available to *all* students on the basis of student preference and selection.
- **Designated supports** are available to *all* students when determined for use by an educator or team of educators (with parent/guardian and student input, as appropriate) or specified in the student's individualized education program (IEP) or Section 504 plan.
- **Accommodations** must be permitted on CAASPP and ELPAC tests to all eligible students if specified in the student's IEP or Section 504 plan.

Statewide Assessments: Just One Measure of Sophia's Progress

California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) results in English language arts/literacy (ELA) and mathematics give one measure of how well students are mastering California's challenging academic standards. The skills called for by these standards—the ability to write clearly, think critically, and solve problems—are essential for preparing students for college and a 21st-century career.

What do my child's scores mean?

There are four levels of scores for ELA and mathematics. "Standard Met" and "Standard Exceeded" are the state targets for all students.

- Standard Exceeded (Level 4)
- Standard Met (Level 3)
- Standard Nearly Met (Level 2)
- Standard Not Met (Level 1)

Score ranges for each level are different for each grade, and the standards for the next grade are higher than for the previous grade. As a result, students may need a higher score to stay in the same level as the previous year.

Statewide Assessments: Just One Measure of Sophia's Progress

This year, students in grade five took the California Science Test (CAST). This test measures students' understanding of the California Next Generation Science Standards (CA NGSS), which cover the core ideas, concepts, and practices in science and engineering. The CAST is one measure of your child's academic performance. Your child's results should be viewed with other available information—such as classroom tests, assignments, and grades.

About the CAST for Grade Five

The CAST is a science test that measures how well your child understands the scientific core ideas, concepts, and practices in the CA NGSS. The CAST assesses skills such as critical thinking and problem solving. The CAST contains stand-alone questions and performance tasks. The stand-alone questions include multiple choice, matching, fill-in, graphing, and short written responses. The performance tasks ask students to make sense of scientific phenomena in simulated experiments or real-world situations. The knowledge and skills assessed on the CAST are critical for students to be prepared for success in college or a career.





Sophia's 2022–23 California Science Test (CAST)




