DMS'S DRESS CODE

Purpose

The purpose of this code is to provide the students, parents, faculty, and administration guidelines as to the standards of dress expected in our school. The learning environment must be free as possible from distractions/interruptions. The following requirements are applicable to both male and female students except where indicated:

ONLY CLEAR OR MESH BOOKBAGS ARE ALLOWED AT DMS.

Tops:

Shirts can be any solid color, polo-style, button-down oxford, or t-shirt (short or long sleeves) with images, emblems, or artwork no larger than an inch. Any symbol larger than a quarter is too big. Any shirt with a Dublin Middle School logo, insignia, sports team or club can be worn at any time. All other Dublin City Schools spirit shirts can be worn on Fridays. No tank tops or tops that are lace, sheer, seethru, or show a student's mid-section/stomach will be allowed. Shirts must be tucked in for boys.

Bottoms:

Bottoms must be solid khaki, brown, black, blue or gray uniform or denim-style pants, skirts, skorts, capri pants, or jumpers. Joggers ARE allowed but must be uniform-style pants and cannot be sweatpants-type martial. Cargo pants ARE also allowed, but they must be the same as the colors above. Additionally, Dublin Middle School athletic pants/sweatpants (not tight-fighting) can be worn. Pants, shorts, and jeans must NOT be torn, ripped, cut or frayed or have holes of any kind. Leggings CANNOT be worn as "stand-alone" attire. They can be worn under skirts/shorts and must be a solid color. Skirts/shorts must be no shorter than the fingertips when arms are extended and/or two inches above the knee. NO SAGGING OF BOTTOMS WILL BE ALLOWED!!

Shoes:

Shoes may be any color. All shoes must have an enclosed toe and strap on the back. Students cannot wear sandals, flip-flops, cleats or spiked high heels to school.

Outerwear:

Students will be allowed to wear sweatshirts or jackets with hoods attached while on campus. However, hoods CANNOT be worn on or over the head while on campus. Solid-color sweaters, sweatshirts, and cardigans may be worn over a uniform shirt. Solid color turtlenecks can also be worn. We have no restrictions on jacket colors; however, no outerwear can bear inappropriate messages or images. No trench coats or dusters will be permitted.

Belts/Accessories:

Belts must be leather or cloth and worn in the belt loops. Buckles must be plain and not oversized, ornate, or offensive in design or message. Accessories cannot be oversized or in excessive amounts. Masks are highly encouraged but not required.

As principal, I will have the authority to make case-by-case determinations about the appropriateness of dress not covered in this policy.


EXTRACURRICULARS
