ELEMENTARY DRESS CODE

(KINDERGARTEN - 4TH GRADE)

Want to dress cool for school and still follow the rules? Here's how!

Tops

- Solid Color "Polo-style" or button down oxford long or short sleeve shirt
 - Any solid color shirt
- · Can be short or long-sleeved
- Emblems can be no larger than an "inch"
 - Any symbol bigger than a "quarter" is too big!
- Any shirt with the schools' logos, insignias, sports team, or club can be worn any time and all other Dublin City School spirit shirts can be worn on Fridays.
- Absolutely NO
 - Sheer
 - Lace
 - See-thru
- Shirts must be tucked in for boys and girls.

Shoes

- Shoes may be any color.
- All shoes must have an enclosed toe and strap on the back.
- Absolutely NO
 - Sandals
 - Flip-flops/slides
 - Cleats
 - Heelies
 - Spiked heels
 - Crocs

- Outerwear/Accessories

 Masks/gaiters ARE NOT REQUIRED, BUT STRONGLY ENCOURAGED!
- Students can wear sweatshirts or jacks with hoods.
 - Hoods CANNOT be worn inside of school.
- Solid Color sweaters, sweatshirts and cardigan may be worn.
 - These must be over a uniform shirt.
 - Solid color turtlenecks can be worn.
- No restrictions on jacket colors
 - No inappropriate slogans or inappropriate messages
 - · No trench coats or dusters
- Belts must be leather or cloth
 - no oversized or ornate accessories of any kind

Bottoms

- Uniform-Style
 - Colors are khaki, brown, black, navy blue or grey.
 - Cargos are allowed but they must be the same as the colors above.
- Joggers
 - Joggers ARE allowed but MUST be the uniform-style pant and can't be sweat pant type material
 - NO SAGGING!
- Jeans
 - Must not have any rips, holes, tears, or frays.
 - NO SAGGING!
- <u>Leggings</u>
 - Leggings can NOT be worn as "stand alone" attire. They can be worn under skirts/shorts and must be a solid color.
- Skirts
 - Must be no shorter than fingertips when arms are extended.

For the 2024-2025 school year, absolutely NO CROCS will be allowed at school.

Absolutely NO

- Hats
- Hoods
- Caps
- Bandanas
- Sunglasses

The principal shall have the authority to make case by case determinations for the appropriateness of dress which is not covered in this policy.

Your child's teacher will provide you with specific school information and events.


