
- Developing self regulation
- Develop friendships
- Plays and works cooperatively with other children
- Prints name
- Proficient at holding a pen, crayons, or a paintbrush
- Able to count to 20 or beyond
- Solve simple addition and subtraction problems with a small number of objects (sums up to 10), usually by counting.
- Showing awareness of rhyming words
- Able to identify most letters of the alphabet
- Able to attach sounds to letters
- Able to recognize own name, other names, and common words in print (environmental print).























Focus Areas of Kindergarten

- Are able to use words to describe their own feelings
- Has expressive language
- Uses all parts of speech
- Knows number names and the count sequence up to 100
- Learn about numbers 11 20, with tens and ones
- Compare numbers and groups
- Understand that addition is putting together groups and adding to groups
- Recognize and name all upper and lowercase letters.
- Use phonics when reading words
- Say the most frequent sounds for each consonant and vowel
- Read common high frequency words by sight









Focus on explicit instruction, guided instruction, small group instruction, and exploration & inquiry.





Kindergarteners have formal physical education instruction. In addition, they have many opportunities to be physically active and engaged with their peers in activities of their choice plus developmental play.

Enrollment

- First day of school for 2024 2025: August 19, 2024
- Enrollment for 2024 2025 now open! Please continue to check the <u>NMUSD enrollment webpage</u> for updates on enrollment for the next school year.
 - Students must be age 5 on or before September 1,
 2024 to enroll in Kindergarten.
 - Students who will be age 5 between September 2, 2024 to June 2, 2025 (inclusive) may enroll in Transitional Kindergarten (TK) OR one of NMUSD's preschool classrooms.
 - Students who will be age 5 after June 2, 2025 may enroll in one of the NMUSD preschool classrooms.

Kindergarten Readiness

*recommendations NOT requirements

- Reading and Language Skills
 - Able to write his/her name
 - Identify 20/30 letters (Upper and lowercase)
 - Speak using complete sentences
 - Recognizes familiar logos and signs, like stop signs

Math

- Count to ten without skipping numbers
- Understand "more than" and "less than".
- Can name basic shapes (square, circle, triangle, rectangle).
- Social and Emotional Skills
 - Separate from parents easily
 - Follows direction
 - Asks for help
 - Problem solves appropriately
- Fine Motor Skills
 - Grip a pencil, crayon, or marker correctly (with the thumb and forefinger supporting the tip)
 - Use scissors, glue, paint, and other art materials with relative ease
