Medical and Athletic Forms

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The school nurse supports student success by providing health care assessments, intervention, and follow-up for all children within the school setting. The school nurse provides care to students and staff who have been injured or who present an acute illness. In addition, the school nurse is responsible for administering medication and performing health care procedures that are within the scope of nursing practices and are ordered by an appropriately licensed health care provider. In order to address potential health problems that are barriers to learning or symptoms of underlying medical conditions, the school nurse often performs proactive safeguards, such as vision and hearing screenings.

If You Are a Newly Enrolled International Student, You Must:

- See a New Jersey (NJ) physician upon arrival
- Complete the W+H Physical Health Form
- Have an authorized NJ physician complete the Preparation Physical Evaluation Form if you plan on participating in a sport
- Bring your vaccination record to a NJ physician for verification. Additional vaccinations may be required by the State of New Jersey
- Be tested for TB (Tuberculosis)
