

Student Wellness and Success Funds (SWSF) and DPIA (Disadvantaged Pupil Impact Aid) Plan

Rationale:

Student overall mental health, wellness, and safety contribute highly to their success in the classroom and beyond. Younger students with limited access to mental health and wellness outside of school have challenges in the learning environment. Older students desire to feel safe, secure, and supported in their schools so that maximum growth and learning can occur. All students who face these challenges experience reduced student attendance that inhibits learning. The Lakewood Local School District will use the student wellness and DPIA funds to produce a safe, supportive environment in our schools where all students can learn.

Goals:

- Increase student attendance by eliminating barriers that impede students, such as medical, social emotional and mental health issues and academic concerns.
- Provide mental health and counseling services and support to all students in the district.
- Provide a safe school environment that contributes to a positive learning climate for all students.
