### ***A Note from Student Services:***

*Students, know that your Third quarter attendance really matters. Students who earn 90% attendance or better for the quarter are eligible for Junior Girls. Any unexcused absences, class periods or days, count against your attendance record. Excused absences (parent, medical, funeral, and school based activities) DO NOT count against your attendance record. Again, the standard to earn dance eligibility is 90%. Any suspension during quarter three, in school or out of school, will also result in a loss of dance eligibility. Please do your best to make it to all of your classes every day!*

## A NOTE FROM THE WAUSAU EAST ATTENDANCE OFFICE

Students NEED to sign IN and OUT at the Attendance Window when they are arriving late to school (after 7:45 a.m.) and leaving early from school (before 3:00 p.m.). This DOES NOT pertain to students with Student Incentive periods on their schedule.

Communication between home and school is of utmost importance for the Attendance Office. The following is a list of acceptable reasons your student may miss school:

- Personal illness
- Funerals and religious services as requested by the parent(s) and/or guardian(s)
- Serious personal or family crisis
- The student is not in proper physical and/or mental condition to attend school in accordance with Wisconsin Statute 118.15(3)(a)
- Suspension from school

Students will be excused for the above reasons only when the parent/guardian gives an explanation for the absence. Please call the Attendance Office by 9:30 a.m. on the day of the absence. If this is impossible, please call or send a note with your child on the day of his/her return to school.

Parents/guardians are allowed to excuse their child for part of, or the entirety of, ten days per school year without a medical note. If your child is absent from school for more than ten days, you will be asked to furnish a medical excuse. Absences excused with medical notes are excused without using the ten days previously mentioned. Family vacations or activities must be pre-arranged through the Attendance Office prior to leaving. In such cases, the student must complete an Anticipated Absence Form.

If a student needs to leave for any reason within the school day (7:45 a.m.-3:00 p.m.), they should bring a written note from their parent/guardian indicating the time of dismissal/return and reason. That note should be brought to the Attendance Office by the student before school, to obtain a pass. If parents/guardians are unable to send a note, please call 715-261-0690 a day ahead or early in the morning on the day of the appointment and tell their student to check in with the Attendance Office to obtain a pass. We kindly ask that parents/guardians plan ahead and follow this procedure so classes aren't interrupted for last minute student pickups.

### Three Qualify for ICDC in Anaheim, CA

Eleven Wausau East students participated at the State Career Development Conference (SCDC) in Lake Geneva, WI, at the Grand Geneva Resort Feb. 26 - 28. Our Wausau East students competed amongst over 1,100 Wisconsin DECA members who work all year long to earn their spot at this conference. Students take written exams and compete in role play events. Some students also create projects such as professional selling presentations. The combination of their written test and role play scores determine who moves on to the International Career Development Conference (ICDC). Ben Schuette, Robbie Angiulli, and Brian Nguyen completed a project that earned our School Based Enterprise (the Jack Shack) Gold Certification and earned them a spot to DECA's International Career and Development Conference in Anaheim, California, April 26-30. Ben also took second place in Business Services Marketing and that also qualified him for ICDC. Trevor Doering earned two medals for both of his role plays in Hotel and Lodging Management. Olivier Meney also earned a medal for a role play in Business Services Marketing. Ari Thielen earned Gold Student recognition for her excellent written project and presentation.

The entire Wausau East chapter was also recognized for their contributions to various community service projects and charities. Wausau East's DECA has raised thousands of dollars for our local food pantry and Holiday giving tree, and has performed over 100 community service hours for various causes around the community.

## END OF YEAR REMINDERS FROM THE HEALTH OFFICE

- **Medications:** Please contact the health office, if your child takes medication daily or on an as needed basis to arrange a pick-up time at the end of the school year. These medications must be picked up on or before May 30. Our health office will be closed from May 31 through mid-August. Medication not picked up by May 30 at 3:00 p.m. will be disposed of properly.
- **Summer Learning:** If your child will be attending a summer learning session and will continue their medication routine, those medications may remain at the East Health office until they complete their summer school session(s). Please inform health office staff, if this applies.
- **Summer** is the perfect time to schedule appointments for your child's medication needs and check on immunization requirements. Listed below are some reminders for prescription and over the counter medications, a link to all medication forms on the WSD site and a link to the Marathon County immunization requirements & clinic dates.

**All medication must be kept in the health office. This includes:**

Over the counter pain relievers (Tylenol/Advil or generic)  
Gastrointestinal products (Tums, Imodium, etc.)  
Cold products (cough syrup, cold medicine)  
Ear or eye drops (Visine, etc.)  
Vitamins/probiotics  
Prescription medication

**Students are not allowed to self-carry/self-administer medication unless approved by school nurse/health care provider.**

**EpiPens, inhalers and diabetic supplies may be carried by students. We request that the proper forms be completed. Contact lense supplies and cough drops may be carried by students.**

You may contact the health office directly for the necessary medication administration forms at **715-261-0678** or they may be picked up during office hours. **Forms may also be found on the Wausau School District website at [www.wausauschools.org](http://www.wausauschools.org) under the parent tab, health information or on Parent Portal.** **Forms listed:** Acetaminophen/Ibuprofen administration form, Allergy Action plan, Asthma Action Plan, Seizure Action Plan, Medication Administration Consent form. **Completed forms from both sites must be printed by parent/guardian. Forms may be turned in during schedule pick up, faxed to the number listed below, or dropped off at your convenience to the East Health Office. We have no access to forms completed online at this time.**
