Dear RCSD Community Member,

Every year at about this time. I begin what I call the "Budget Road Show." Immediately after the next year's school district budget is approved by the Board of Education and changes from the proposed budget to the adopted budget, I am on the move. I've been doing this since I first came to the District in 2017, and it's one of the best parts of my job.

I meet with all kinds of different groups, from the seniors at Rye Rec to the members of Rye Rotary and the Lions Club. I've been welcomed by the Community Synagogue, the nursery schools, and the Women's Club of Rye. I've met with realtors and the volunteers of Children's



Philanthropy -- really anyone who will have me! (Hint, hint, I am available if you are a member of a group that is interested).

I generally begin by providing an overview of what the upcoming year's budget covers, and what curricular, programmatic, and physical improvements the budget supports. This year, I'm talking about the new AP Capstone Program and the International Baccalaureate Program at the high school. And the much needed upgrades to the schools' security systems, the gym floor at RHS, the softball field, and the wrestling room. I talk about how the work stemming from the \$79.9M capital bond passed in 2019 is almost complete, and how it's making a difference for students every day.

Without exception, every group has been incredibly welcoming. It's clear that their interest in the welfare of the school district and the students and teachers is deep-seated and real, whether they have children or grandchildren in the schools or not. They understand that the schools belong to everyone in Rye. They have listened with infinite patience and kindness when I talk about the finer points of the school district's budget and its less-than-riveting aspects, like the tax cap calculation. They ask thoughtful, insightful, and sometimes tough questions about the inner workings of the schools and the education the students are receiving.

I have learned so much about Rye, about education, and about people's experiences with both during these meetings. I leave every meeting grateful for this community and its commitment to excellence in public education. Thank you for your support of our schools and our students.

Osborn Student Council Gives Back





A Brainy Bee




