Day 10

Hands of Change

The elements of art are to art what the ABCs are to reading. This project uses the elements of COLOR and LINE.

Art & Social Studies Connection

An **ACTIVIST** is a person who works to bring about social or political change. Anyone can be an activist—even KIDS!

THINK ABOUT IT: What would you change if you were in charge of YOUR SCHOOL? YOUR FAMILY? THE COUNTRY?

Step 1.

Trace your hands on 6 different colors of construction paper. If you don't have that many colors, you may choose to use white paper and color or paint the paper.

Step 2.

Carefully cut out your hand shape (ask an ADULT to help if needed).

Step 3.

Draw and cut out a CIRCLE using BLUE construction paper. Use GREEN construction paper to make different countries. Draw and cut out a HEART using PINK or RED paper. **If you do not have colored construction paper, you may color these shapes using markers and then cut them out.

Step 4.

Glue the GREEN pieces onto the BLUE circle. Glue the HEART in the center of the world. Glue the hands around the world. Write the quote "TOGETHER WE CAN CHANGE THE WORLD!" on the hands as shown in the picture (or have an ADULT help you).

Hang your work somewhere for everyone in your family to enjoy!
