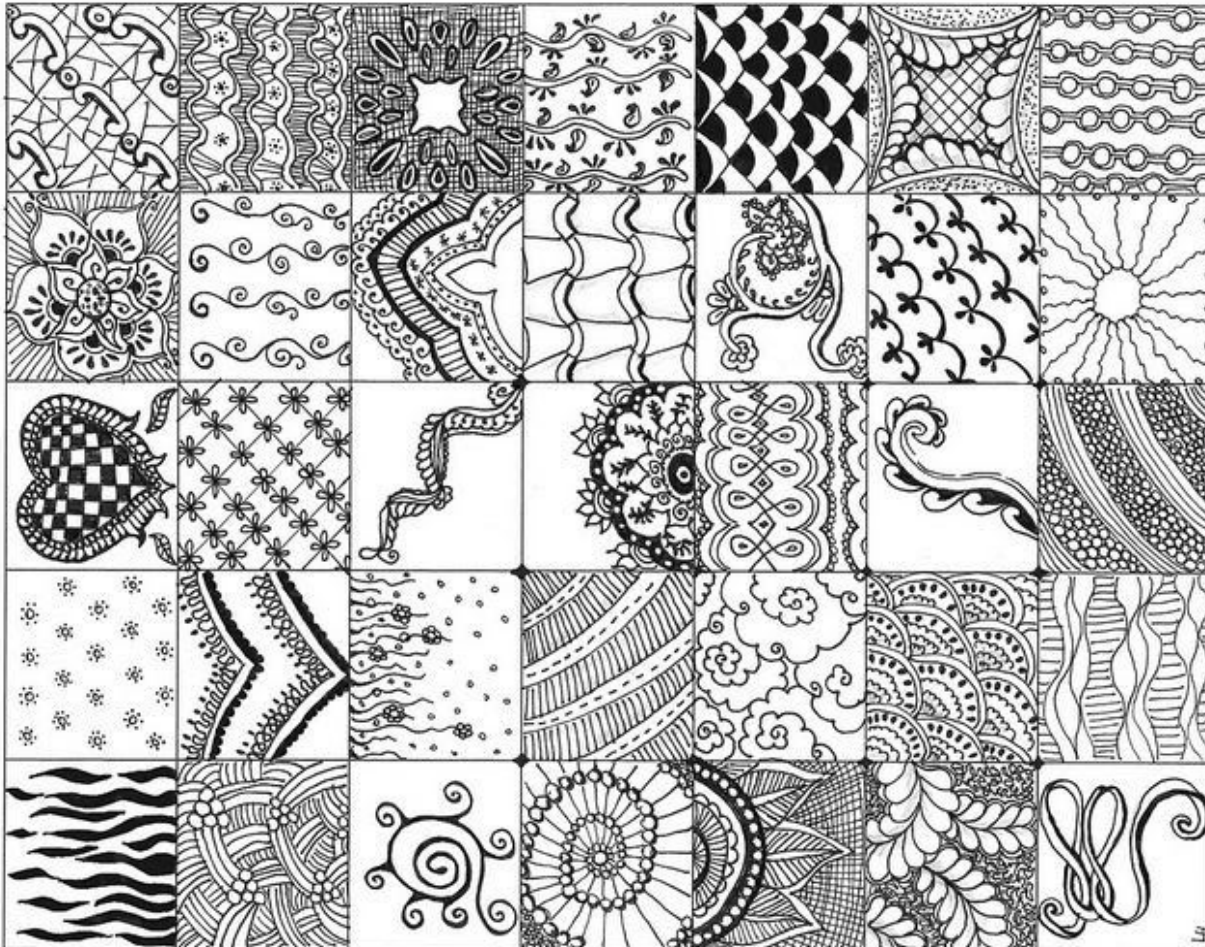
Zentangle Feathers

You will need:
One sheet of paper
A marker or pen

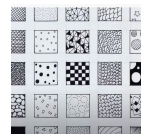
The elements of art are to art what the ABCs are to reading. One of the elements of art is LINES and another is TEXTURE. TEXTURE is when something appears to be smooth, bumpy, soft, or rough. You can use LINES to make a variety of different marks that make fun patterns, and sometimes they even seem to have a TEXTURE.

Here are a bunch of different examples of patterns made from lines. Do some of them seem to have a texture? Can you imagine what they FEEL like?



Your project:

1. Print out the feathers that are on the next page, or draw feathers on a blank sheet of paper.
2. Fill in each section of the feathers with a different Zentangle pattern.
