



ENRICHMENT INFORMATION

- Adult classes are open to persons age 18 and older, unless otherwise indicated.
- Classes are funded by your fees. Classes that do not meet established minimums will have to be cancelled. Cancellation status is normally determined 2 business days prior to the program start date.
- Rochester Community Schools and its administration are not responsible for any activities that take place outside of the class between the teacher and participants.

CONFIRMATION

When you register for RCS Enrichment classes, you will receive a confirmation email and receipt. You may also receive an email if your class information has changed.

MATERIAL FEES

All material fees listed in class descriptions are paid to the instructor at the first class. Before purchasing supplies, check with the office to be sure your class will be meeting.

RETURNED CHECKS

A \$25 fee will be assessed for all returned checks. Your check will no longer be accepted; pay by credit card or cash.

PHOTO/VIDEO RELEASE POLICY

Pictures and/or video recordings are often taken at our programs. By participating in our programs you recognize and agree that Rochester Community Schools may use these photos/videos for future promotions. Please contact the Enrichment Department if you do not wish for your child to be photographed.

CANCELLATIONS / POSTPONEMENT

If Rochester Community Schools are closed due to weather or other emergency conditions, the Enrichment classes are also cancelled. Whenever possible, cancelled classes will be made up. No refunds will be given if a make-up date is available. If group swim lessons are cancelled and there are no make-up dates; open swim passes will be issued, no refunds will be given. Students in the Rochester School District have priority in the use of school buildings for school functions. On occasion, classes might be relocated or suspended for a night due to building activities. We will give advance notice when possible.

REGISTRATION POLICIES

• Registration closes at 12pm two business days prior to the start of the first class (ex. classes starting Monday need to register by the prior Thursday before 12pm).

GENERAL REFUND POLICIES

- A full refund will be granted for all programs cancelled by the instructor/Enrichment. If a class is adjusted as to time, dates or location by Enrichment and you cannot attend, a full refund will be issued.
- Enrollee-requested refunds requested at least 7 days prior to the start of the class will be assessed a \$10 service fee. Regardless of when you have registered.
- Enrollee-requested refunds requested 6 days or less and prior to the start of the second class will be assessed a \$25 service fee, unless otherwise noted below. Regardless of when you have registered.
- Refunds, transfers, or cancellations WILL NOT be allowed after the SECOND class has been held, regardless of attendance or sign-up date.
- Camps (programs meeting 3 days or more in the same week), Private Music Lessons, and Lifeguard Training Courses: Enrollee-requested refunds requested at least 7 days prior to the start of the program will be assessed a \$10 services fee. There will be <u>NO</u> refunds, transfers, or cancellations if requested less than 7 days prior to the program start date. Regardless of when you have registered.
- Substitution of participants is NOT allowed.
- Cancellations made due to an emergency will receive a pro-rated refund, minus a \$10 service fee if approved by the Enrichment Department.
- Punch cards will not be refunded or replaced for any reason, as they have no expiration date.



AQUATICS - TEEN & ADULT SWIM LESSONS

TEEN SWIM (AGES 13-17)/ADULT SWIM (AGES 18+) Beginner: Whatever your ability, this small group instruction for ages 13 and up will help you improve your skills and self-confidence. The lessons are designed for those who have little or no experience in the water. Students will learn submersion into the water, front & back floats, and beginner swim strokes.

Intermediate: The lessons are designed for those who are able to swim at least one length (25 yards) of the pool. Students will focus on endurance and beginner stroke perfection. We will also introduce more advanced swim strokes.

AQUATICS - YOUTH SWIM LESSONS

TADPOLE (AGES 3-5YRS) It will help young children adjust to the water and introduce beginner skills such as water entries, blowing bubbles, floating with assistance, gliding with assistance, safety skills, and exiting the water. Skills are age-appropriate, allowing students to achieve success on a regular basis. No adult participation required.

GUPPY (AGES 4+) It reinforces Tadpole skills and introduces other fundamental skills such as front floats and glides, arm strokes and kicking, combining arm and leg actions, going underwater, and safety skills. No adult participation required.

AQUATICS - YOUTH SWIM LESSONS

CLOWN FISH (AGES 5+) It focuses on coordinating arm and leg movements and improving upon skills learned in Tadpole and Guppy classes. Students should feel very comfortable in the water at this point. They will learn how to develop positive attitudes and safe practices around the water. Exercises include bobbing, rhythmic breathing, front and back glide (with and without kick), combined stroke on front & back finning, treading water and safety skills are taught. No adult participation required.

NEON FISH (AGES 6+) It introduces children to basic, unassisted water skills. This includes floating and gliding (front & back), front crawl swim stroke, backstroke swim stroke, rhythmic breathing, jellyfish float, and basic safety skills. No adult participation required.

AQUATICS - YOUTH SWIM LESSONS

RAINBOW FISH (AGES 7+) Students continue to learn unassisted swimming skills such as front crawl and backstroke, turning over, changing directions, treading water, and rhythmic breathing. They also begin their introduction to deep water skills and more advanced safety skills. No adult participation required.

FLAG FISH Students build on previous skills through additional guided practice. They continue to develop their front crawl and backstroke with rhythmic breathing. They learn new skills such as jumping into deep water, dolphin kicks, scissors kicks, elementary backstroke. Students must be able to perform front crawl with very good, consistent rhythmic breathing before moving to the next level. No adult participation required.

AQUATICS - YOUTH SWIM LESSONS

PARROT FISH This class refines previously learned strokes and improves overall swimming skills. Students will be expected to perform the front crawl and backstroke with rhythmic breathing for 15 yards each. They will also work on developing the elementary backstroke, sidestroke, and treading water. They will learn new skills such as the survival float, sitting dive, and kneeling dive. No adult participation required.

MARLIN This class is intended to coordinate and refine previously learned swim strokes. Students will be introduced to the butterfly & breaststroke, feet first surface dive, and head first dive. This class will also build endurance in front crawl and backstroke, treading water, and underwater. No adult participation required.

AQUATICS - YOUTH SWIM LESSONS

SAILFISH This class will polish strokes and help students swim with more ease, efficiency, and power for greater distances. Students will learn front-flip turn and back-flip turn as well as pike and tuck surface dives and sculling. Students will also learn to perform a shallow angle dive from the side. Students will be expected to perform the front crawl and backstroke for 100 yards each, and the breast stroke, side stroke, and butterfly for 50 yards each, surface dive for retrieval of diving brick in 8 feet of water, and a 500 yard swim.

BARRACUDA (**AGES 10+**) Front crawl–100 yards, Backstroke–100 yards, Butterfly–50 yards, Elementary backstroke–50 yards, Breaststroke–50 yards, Sidestroke–50 yards. Students will perform the Cooper 12-minute swim test (swim for 12 minutes to cover the greatest distance possible, using whatever stroke is preferred. Rest as necessary, but go as far as possible) and will compare the results over the length of the course.


