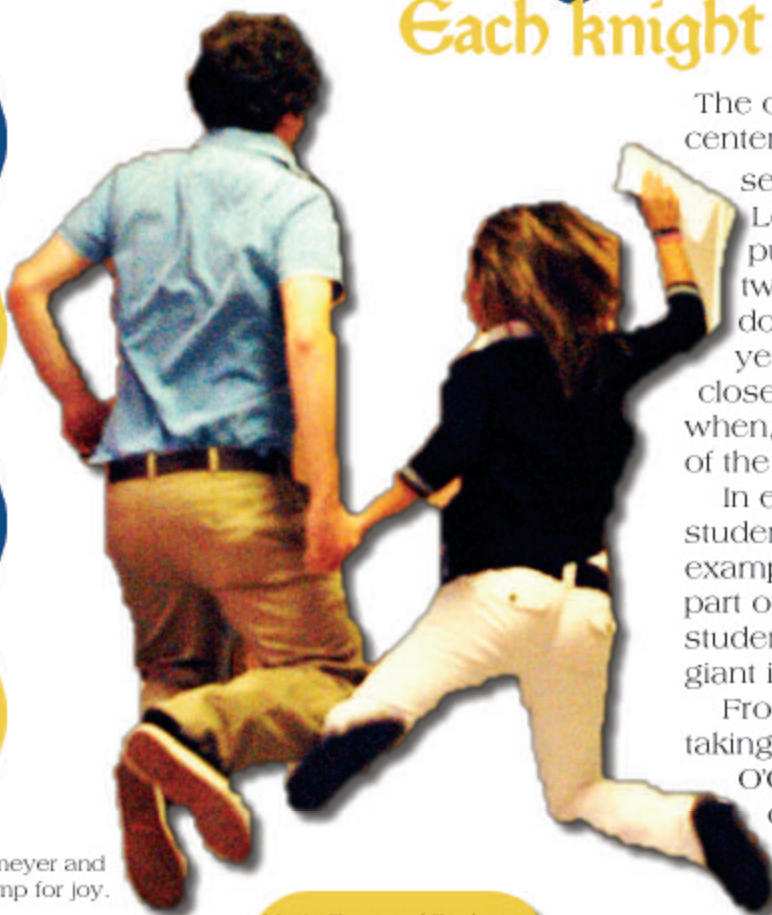

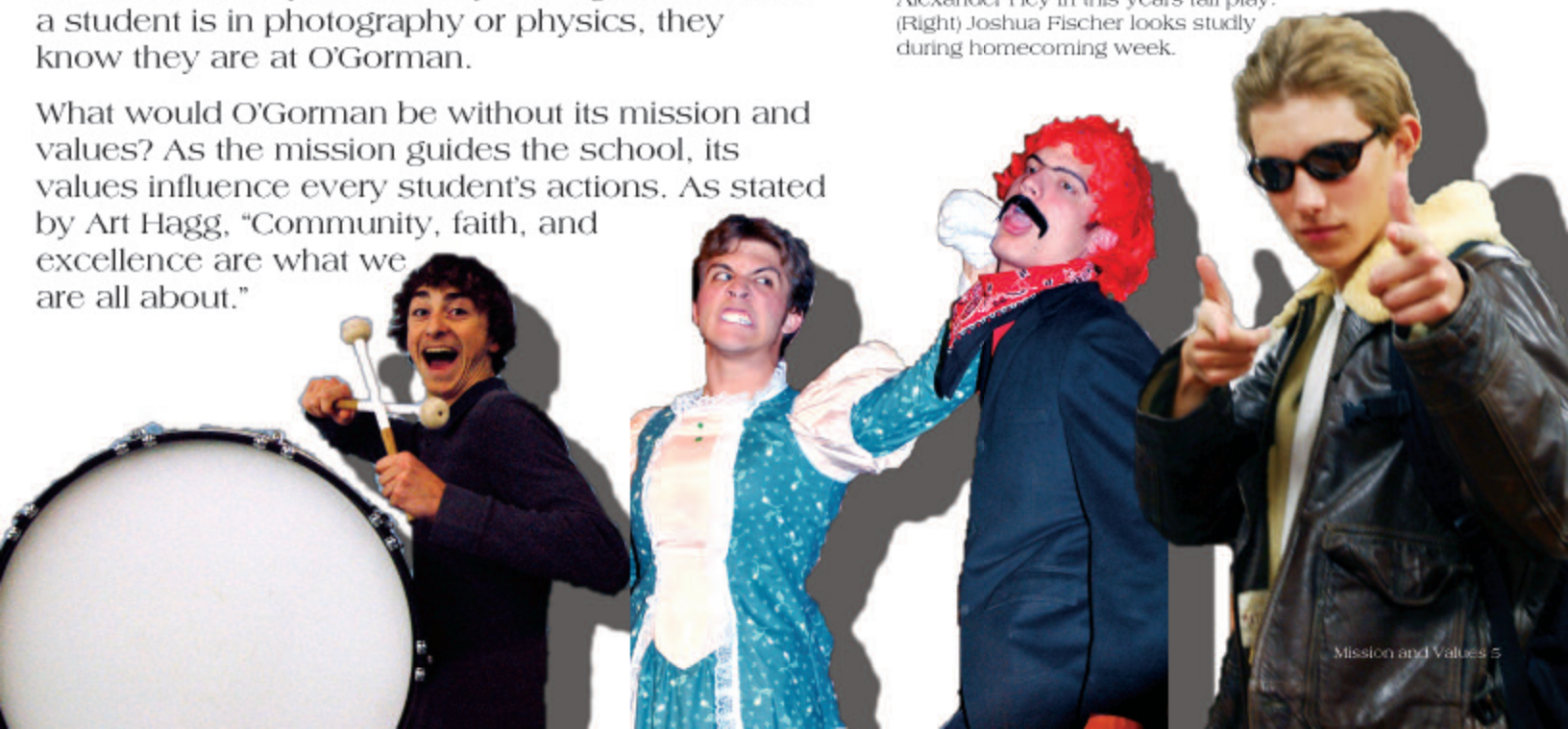

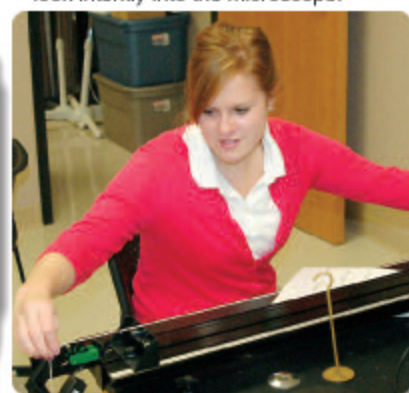

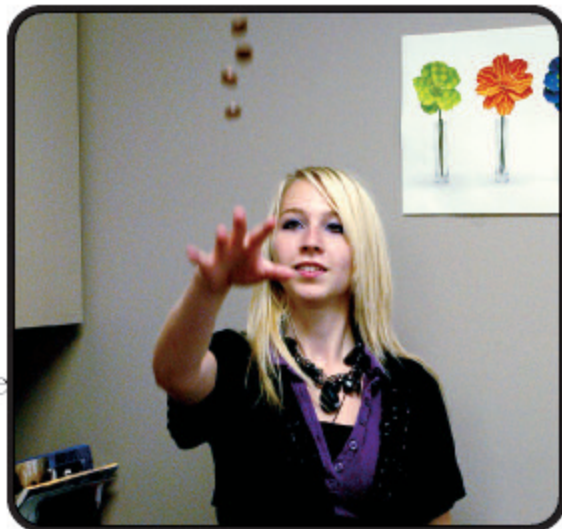

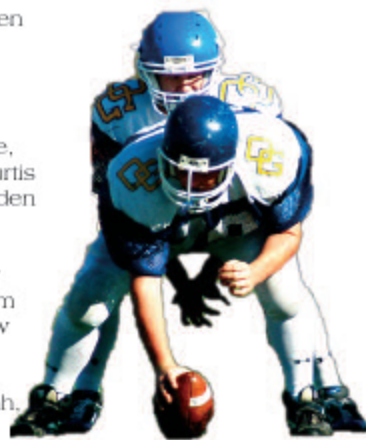

## Champions in the making

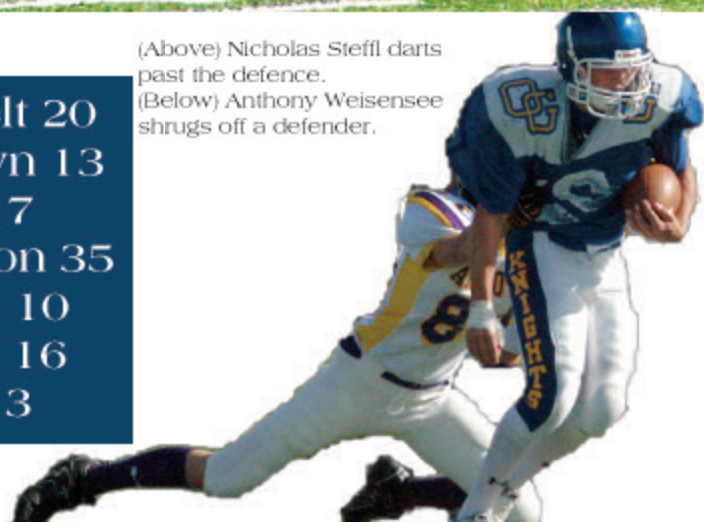

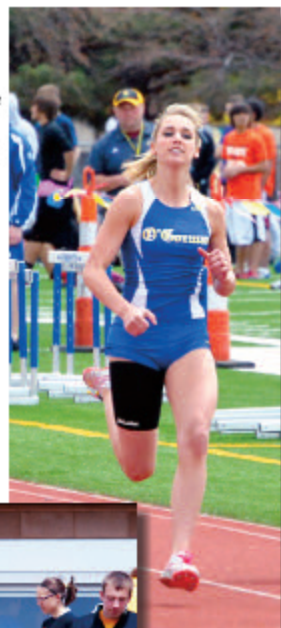

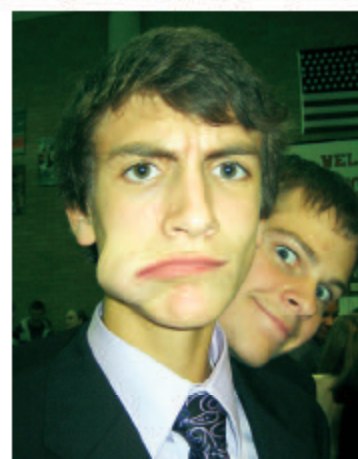


# Oral Interp

# The Kids Left, The Dog Died, Now What?

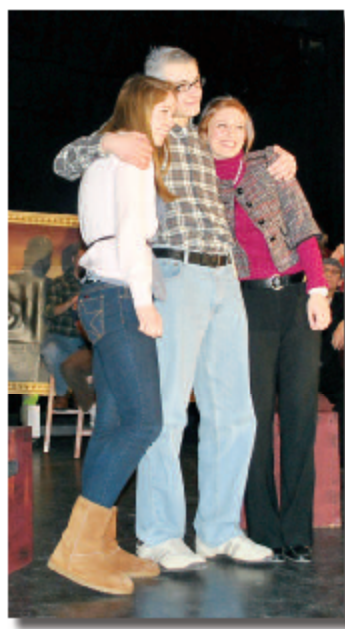

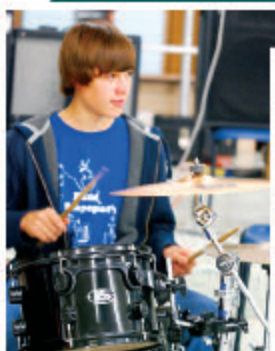
