





Fifty years ago, Bishop Hoch had a vision to create a school where students could have the opportunity to attend a centralized Catholic High School. Many questioned his vision but the Catholic Community supported him. We now look back and thank Bishop Hoch for his vision 50 years ago. We now open the doors to a new Performing Arts Center that will serve our students for another 50 years. Mr. Joe Rutten stated recently, "To those that continue to help, your reward will be found in a renewal of faith life in our young people, and a strengthening of the Catholic community in the future. During the first year of O'Gorman, tuition was \$90 per student and enroll was 550. It was built on a 40 acre alfalfa field on the southwestern edge of the city. On September 7th 1961, O'Gorman opened its 1.5 million dollar Catholic High School. Segregation within classes lasted through the 1960's. The original staff consisted of five priests, 18 nuns, and six lay teachers. The boys were mostly taught by priests and laymen while girls were primarily taught by nuns. The first uniform was dark brown sweaters, white blouses, and brown plaid skirts for the ladies and the boys wore brown cordonary sport coats, white shirts, and ties with slacks. In the 1970's tuition increased to over \$200 per student but work study opportunities became available. School lunch became an option and meals were \$.40 a piece. Uniforms changed a tad as well; boys could choose to wear the brown sport jackets or brown cardigan sweaters. Girls could now wear colored shirts or blouses with their brown skirts and also brown sweaters. Smoking in the bathrooms was also a common pass period time. In the 1980's tuition raised increasingly. It was now \$1,175 per student by 1987. In 1981, the Knights football team took their first state championship title. Fr. Chuck Cimpl was assigned to be the chaplaincy where he lived in the school for many years. He would do anything from helping students to cleaning a different part of the school every night. In the 1990's the uniforms were changed dramatically. Girls were now allowed to wear any brown plaid skirt with a colored solid sweater or a brown or tan skirt with any color top, nylons, socks, and dress shoes. Boys could now wear solid colored white, tan, brown, grey, or black slacks, a shirt with a collar or crewneck sweater, shoes and dress shoes. Girl athletics became more popular demanding more gym space so the Recreation Center was added in 1991. The Minor Seminary became the O'Gorman Junior High School. Together, the High School and Junior High would make the O'Gorman Campus. The new Millenium became some of O'Gorman's greatest years. Receiving many academic awards like Blue Ribbon School, Top 50 High School in the Nation, and named to the Catholic Honor Roll. Instead of a uniform the administration adapted a dress code consisting of khaki pants, colored polo's, socks, and dress shoes for both girls and boys. With a goal of raising 25 million dollars, a new facility was built, along with a 1,000 seat Performing Art Center, and McEneaney field got a new bleachers, instant replay, new concessions, and a new bathroom.





The Math department excelled in a variety of ways. O'Gorman offered many different math classes ranging from Algebra and Geometry to Finite math and AP Calculus.



## Social Studies














## Project
























### Graduation
