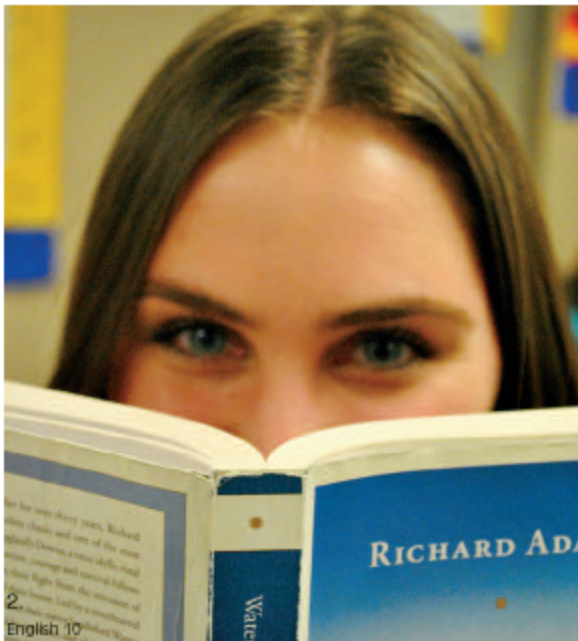


# ENGLISH

# WE SPEAK YOUR LANGUAGE

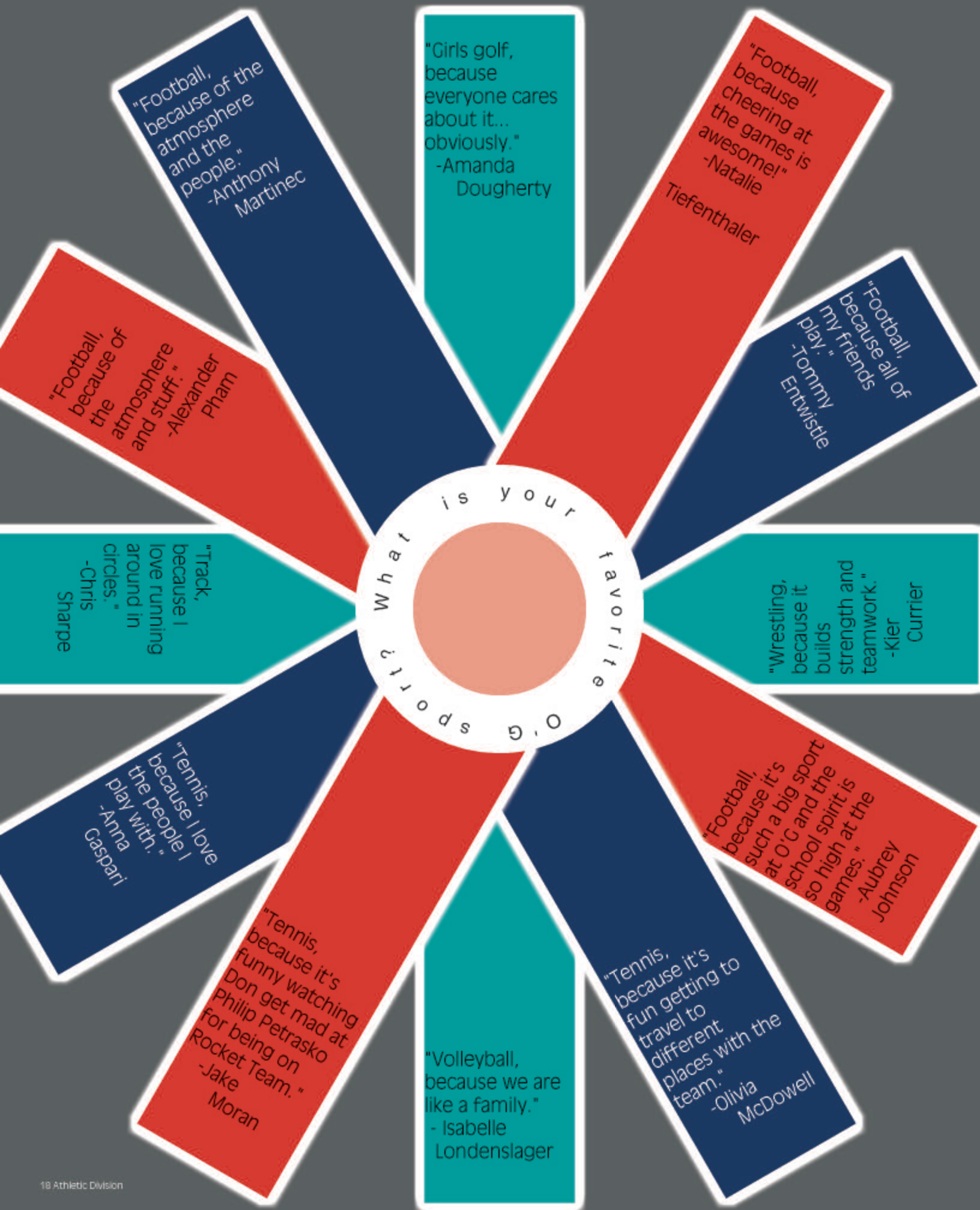

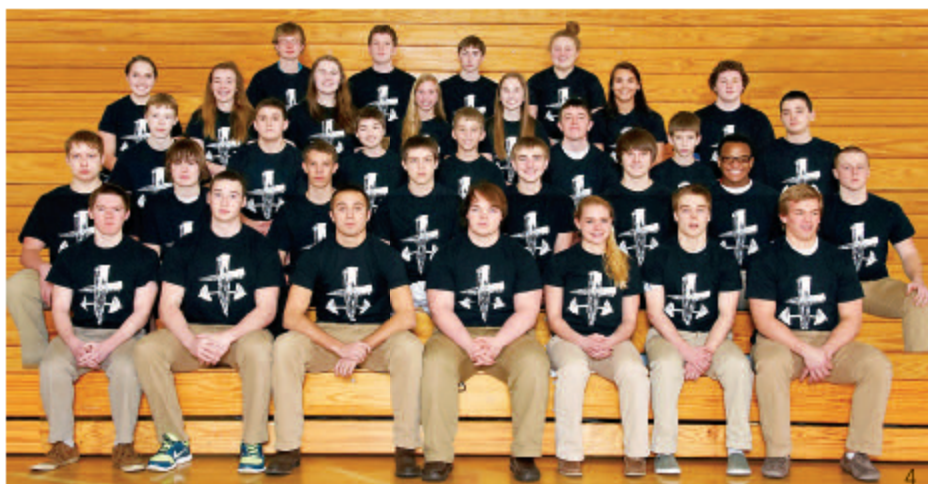

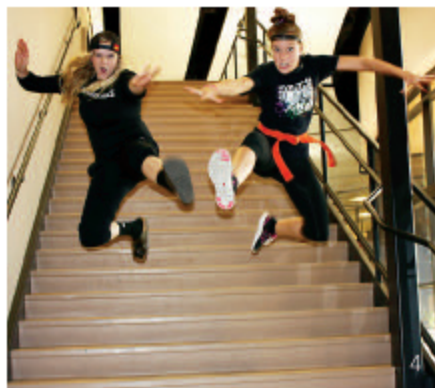

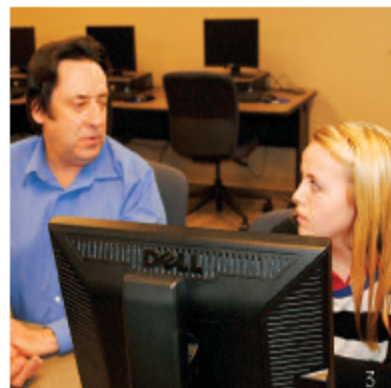
