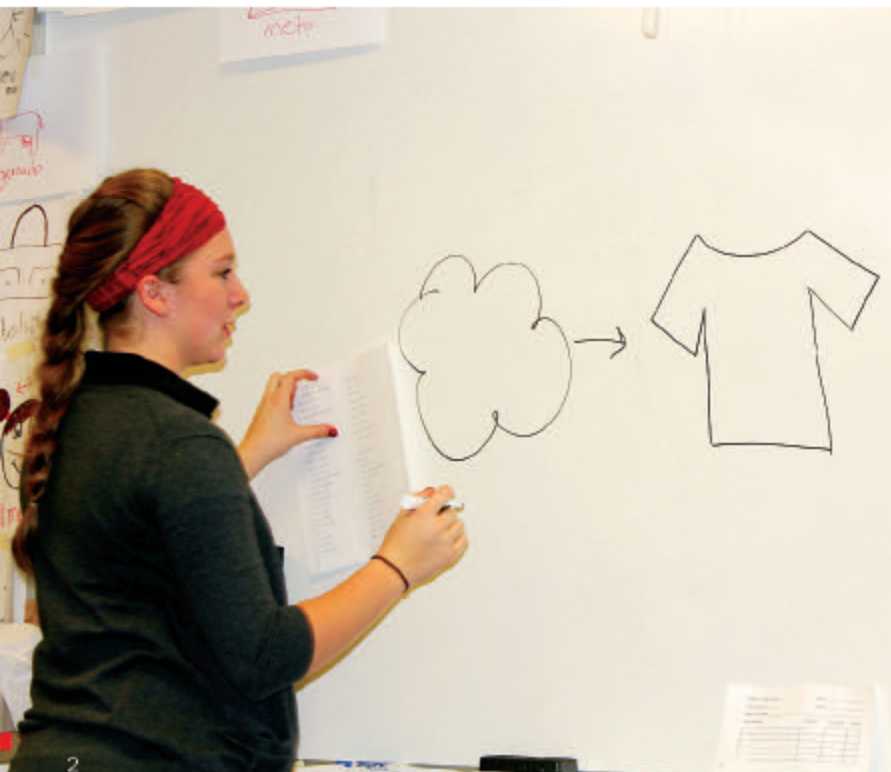

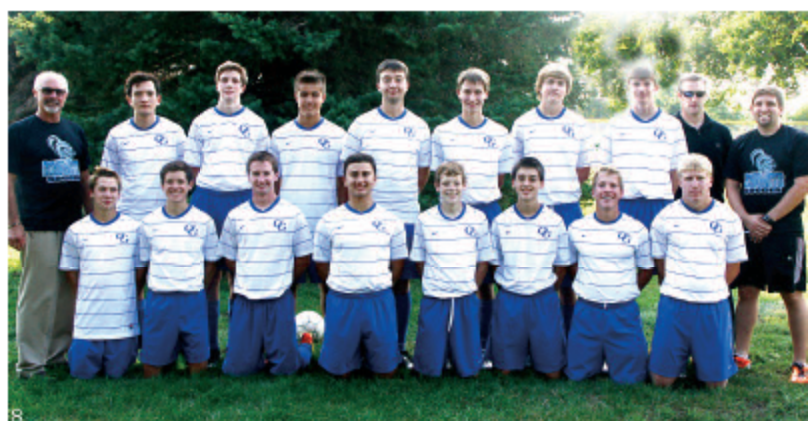

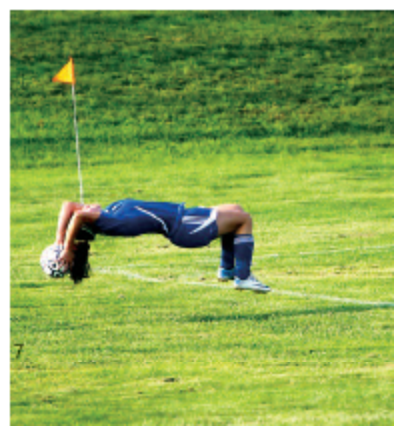

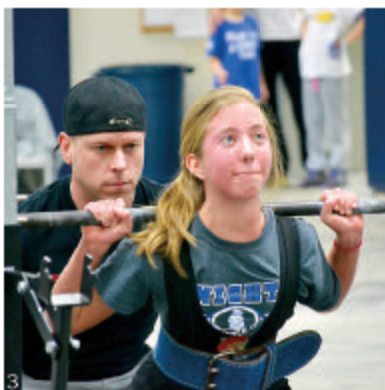

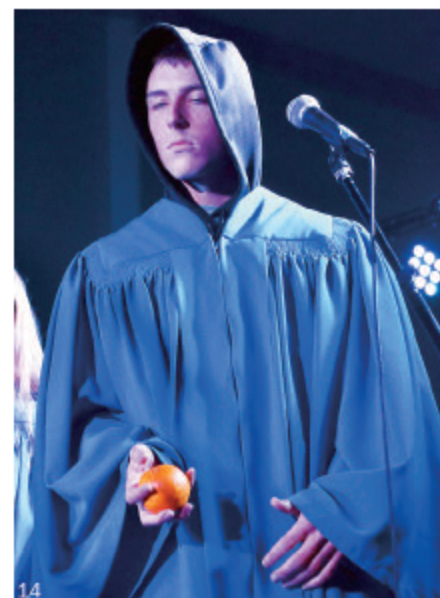

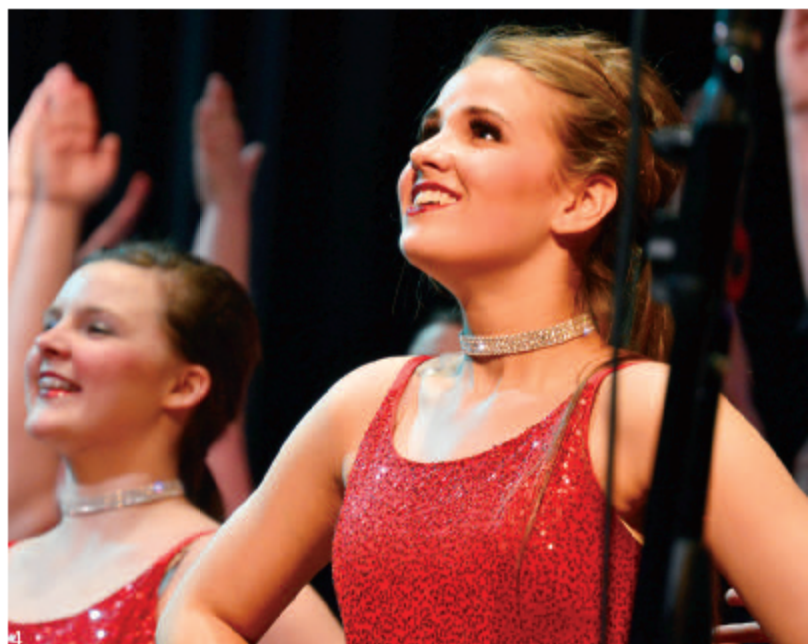

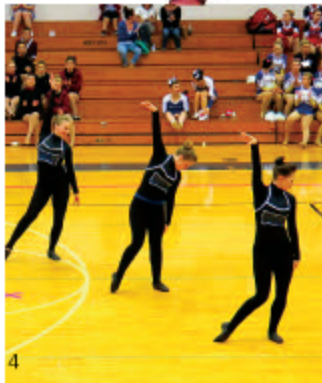

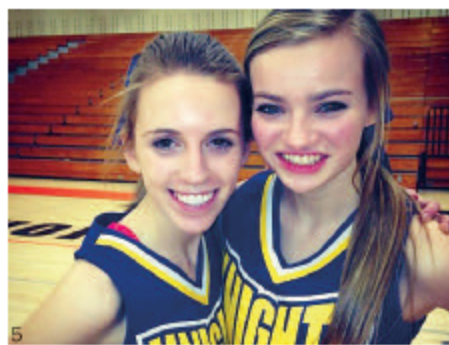

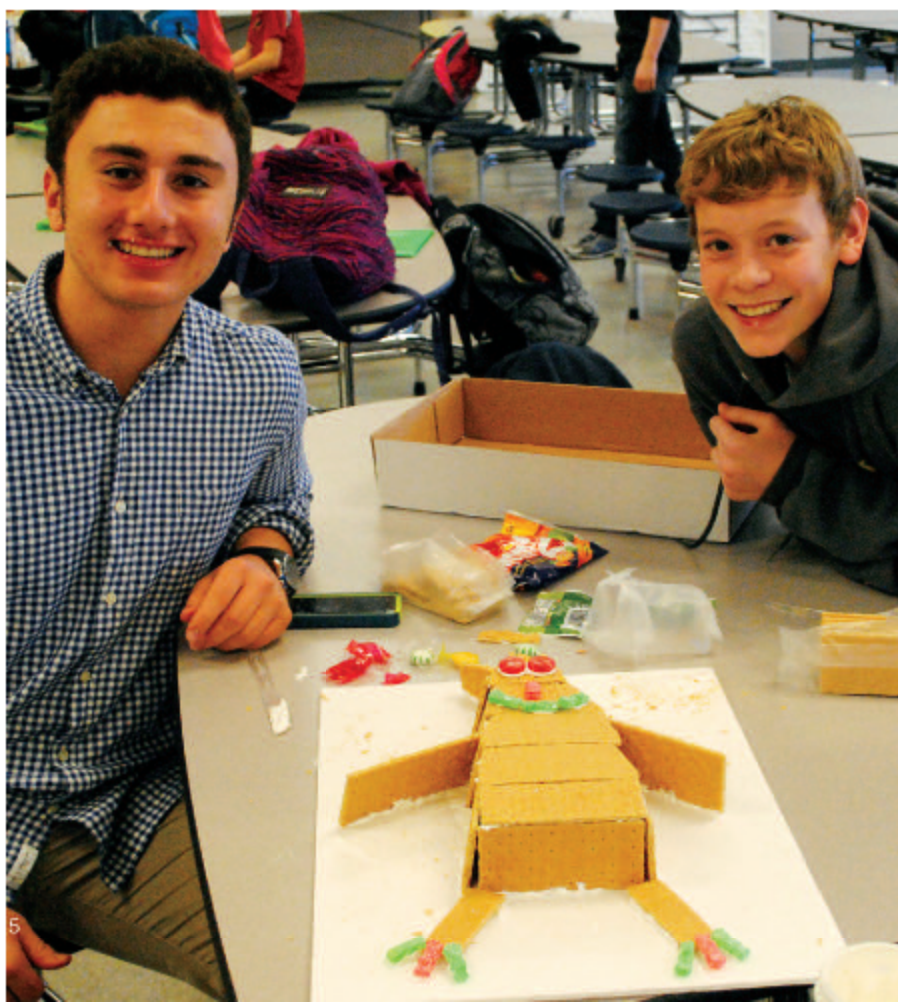
Fellowship of Christian Athletes

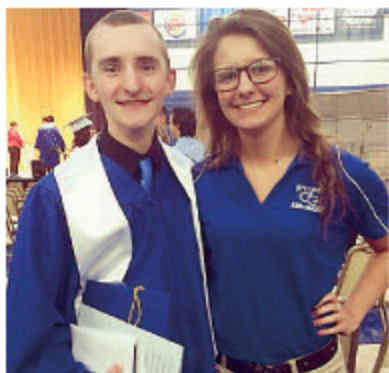
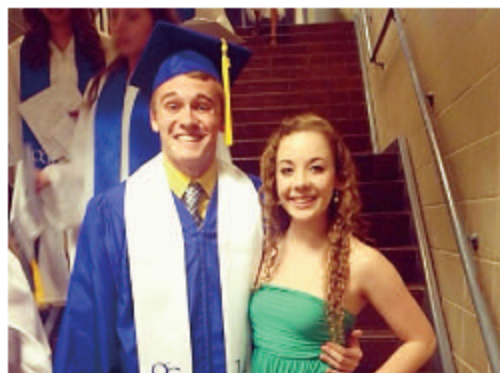
SENIOR ALL KNIGHTER
