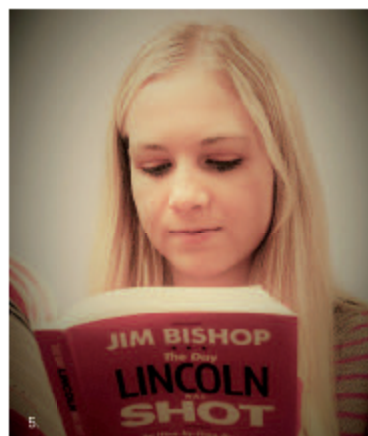

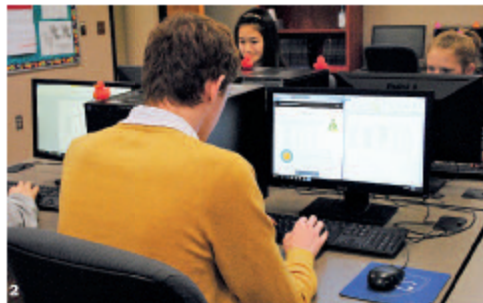

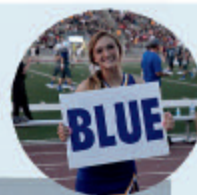

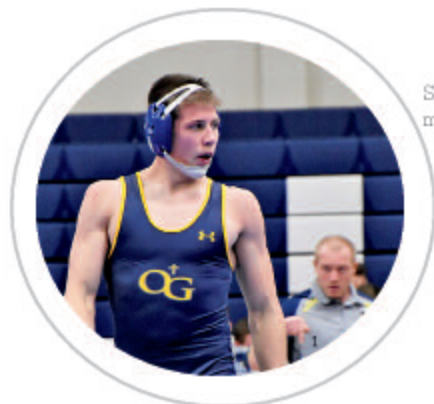

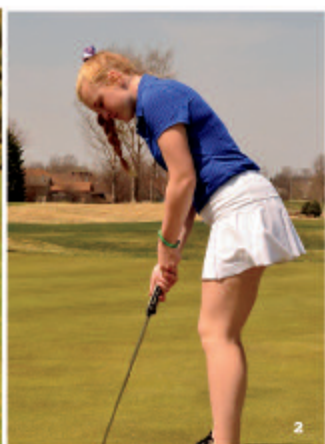

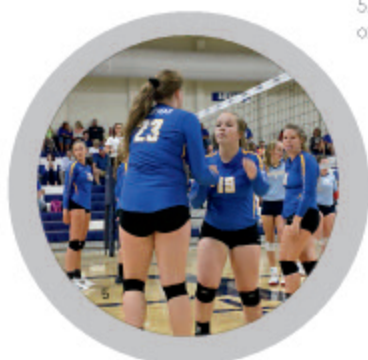

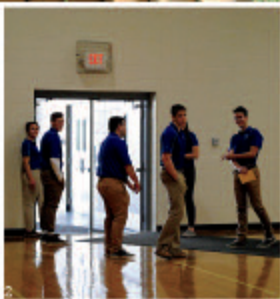
Student Ambassadors and Student Council

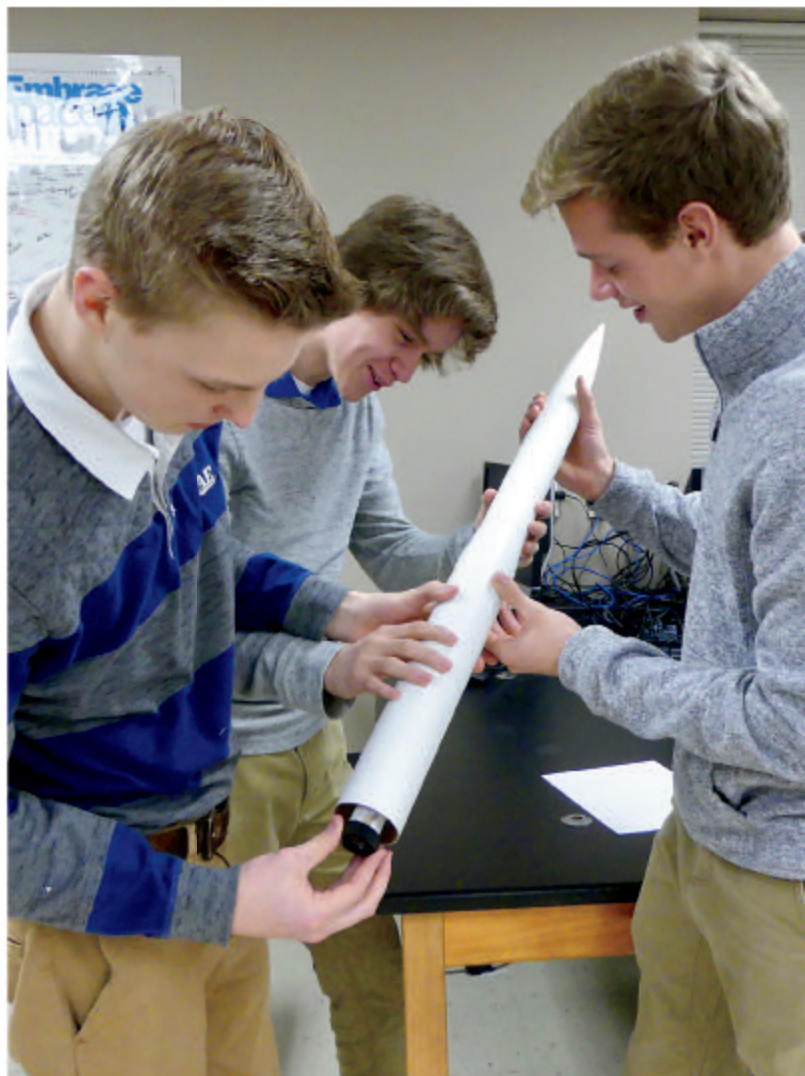
