


CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION



moments of great potential. I'm happy with the way the season went and proud of my teammates. I can't wait for next season," says Struck. Overall, the future looks bright for these young athletes.




Future Gains




Freshman & Sophomore Boys Basketball




Dream Bigger $Big\ Fish$








$Almost\ to$ the Finish
