We are proud to be named after Bishop Thomas O'Gorman, noted educator and second Bishop of Sioux Falls. O'Gorman's original staff consisted of five priests, 18 nuns, and six lay teachers. O'Gorman has come a long way, we are proud of what we have accomplished. Our faith has molded us into who we are today. ## OUR STORY

O'Gorman High School has always been known for having strong academic rigor with regards to course selection. Throughout the years, O'Gorman High School has expanded in its class offerings with varied curriculum. Today, O'Gorman offers a wide range of subjects and electives that the students can take as desired. Course offerings range from Business to World Language and Fine Arts as well as the basic Mathematics, Science, and English courses. In the Mathematic courses, one could take Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II, and an optional choice of Algebra III, College Algebra, or Pre-Calculus. 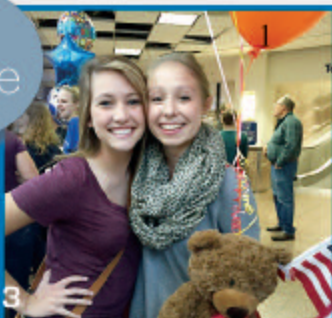

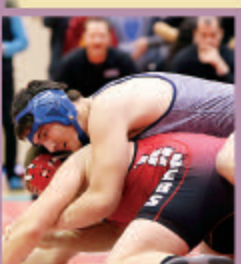

# Varsity Girls Soccer

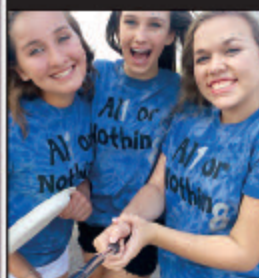
## State Champs

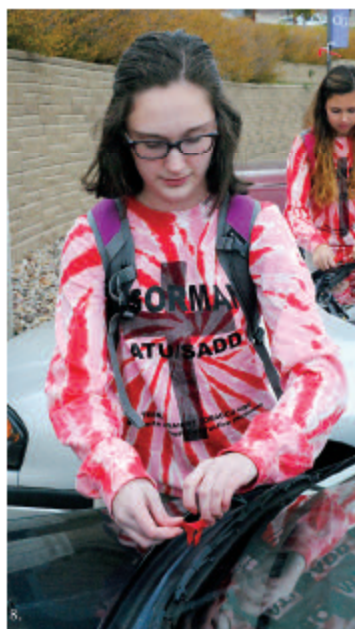
## The Goal of Helping Others
