










Over 50 years ago, Bishop Lambert Hoch had a vision where it was possible for all students to attend a centralized Catholic high school. O'Gorman High School has helped hundreds of students grow and develop in their faith. The Catholic community supported the \$1.5 million project and on September 7, 1961 O'Gorman High School opened it's doors to about 550 students. When O'Gorman opened, tuition was \$90 per student. We are proud to be named after Bishop Thomas O'Gorman, noted educator and second Bishop of Sioux Falls. O'Gorman's original staff consisted of five priests, 18 nuns, and six lay teachers. O'Gorman has come a long way, we are proud of what we have accomplished. Our faith has molded us into who we are today. 

### OUR STORY

O'Gorman High School has always been known for having strong academic rigor with regards to course selection. Throughout the years, O'Gorman High School has expanded in its class offerings with varied curriculum. Today, O'Gorman offers a wide range of subjects and electives that the students can take as desired. Course offerings range from Business to World Language and Fine Arts as well as the basic Mathematics, Science, and English courses. In the Mathematic courses, one could take Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II, and an optional choice of Algebra III, College Algebra, or Pre-Calculus. The English department had English I, English II, English III, and English IV. The Science courses offered a range from Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, and a choice of Anatomy or Physics. Classes were also available as advanced courses depending on the sudents' interest in the subject. The students at O'Gorman were required to take a variety of Theology classes that include Ethics and Relationships, Discipleship, Marriage and Vocations, Modern Saints, Apologetics, and ATS. For students that needed help, before, during, or after school, O'Gorman provided them with the academic service staff that was there to help. Mr. Anderson was one staff member that helped greatly in offering these services, "What I think makes O'Gorman stand out from another schools is the support we provide for students who need more assistance. We provide foundation classes for students who need a modified curriculum and we also offer students accommodations if they need them."





# **CHILDREN'S SHOW**


