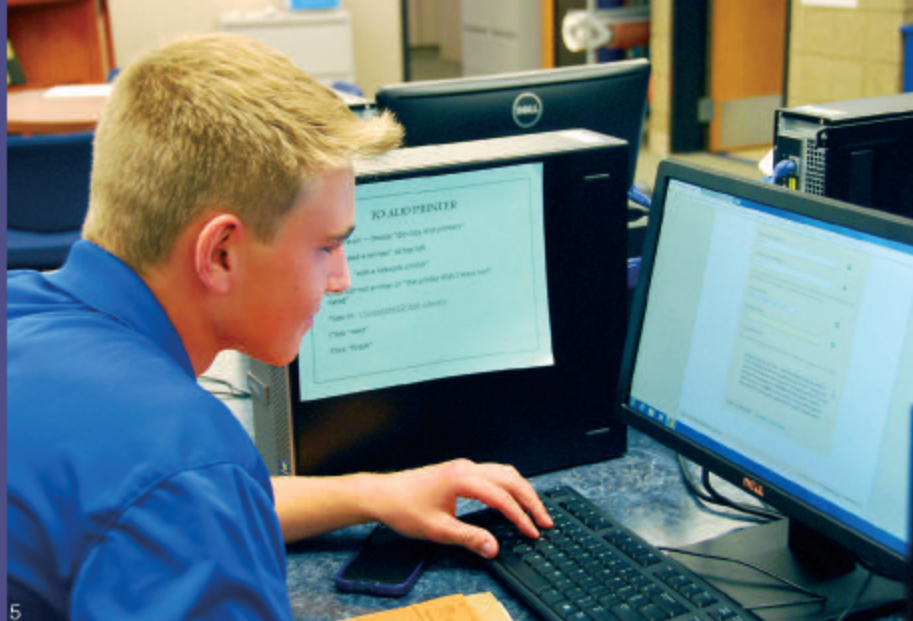

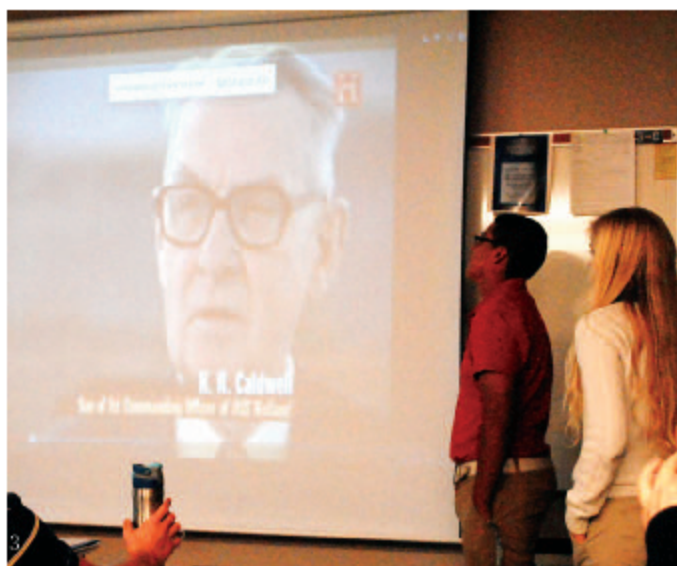

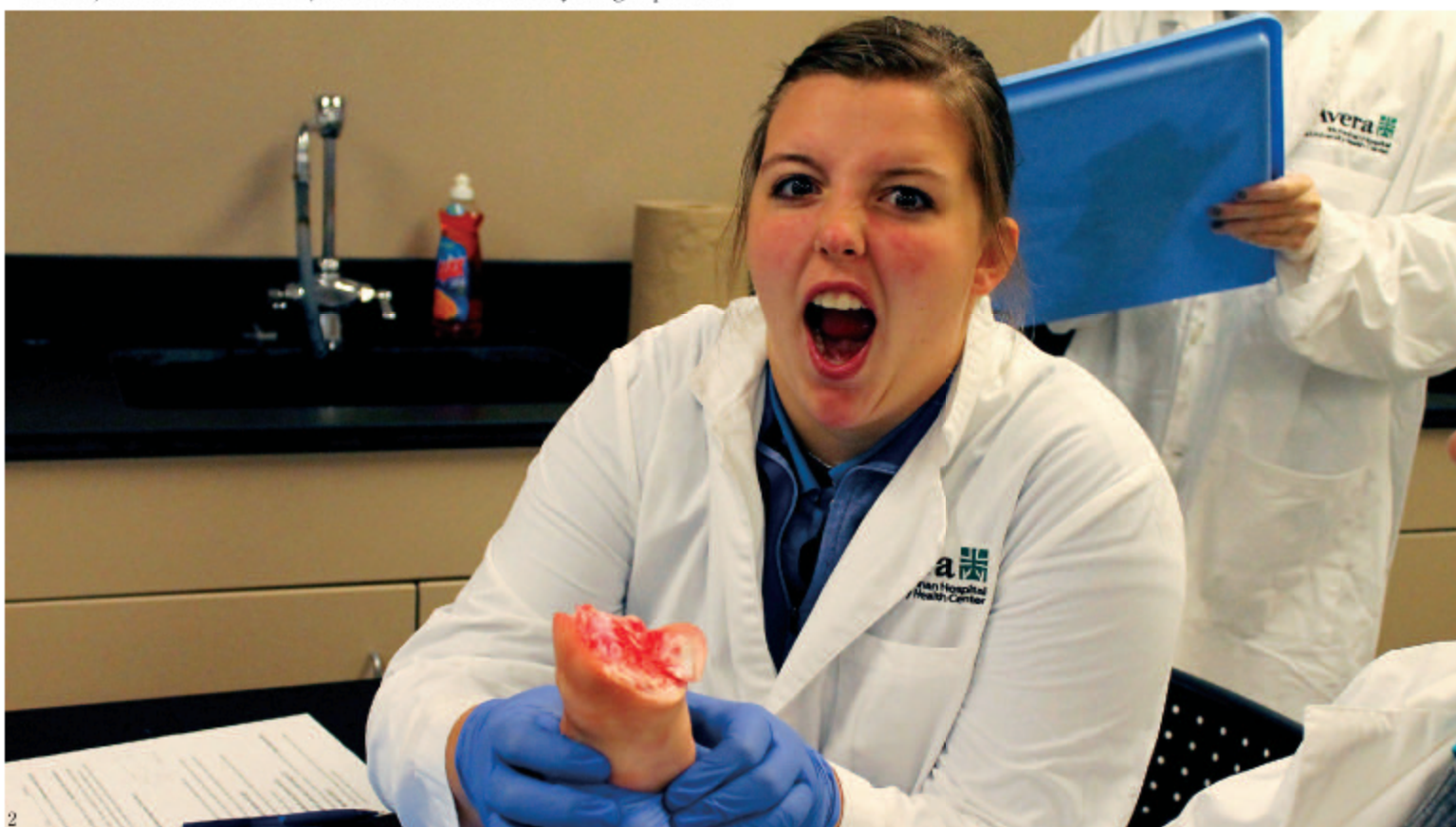
Science

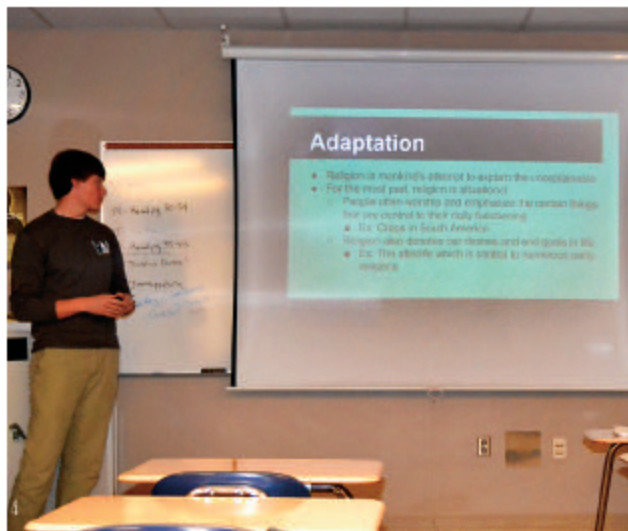

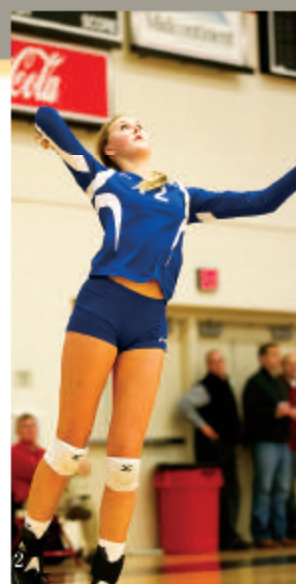

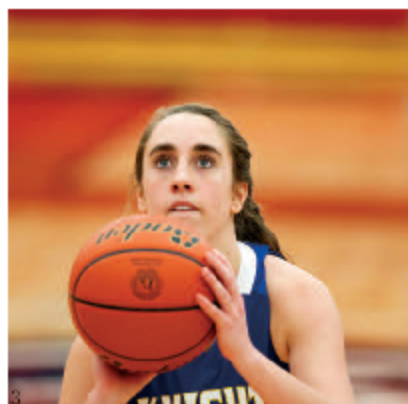

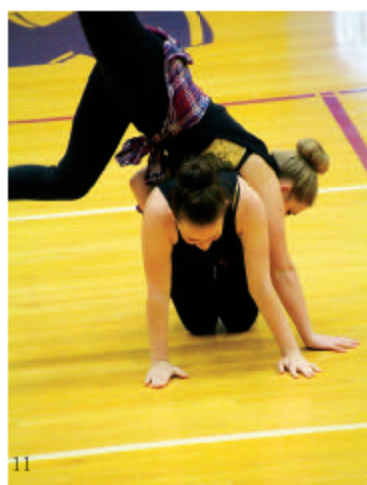
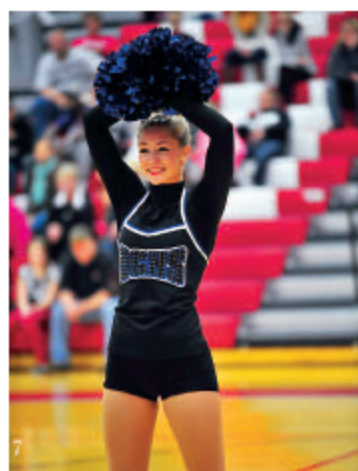

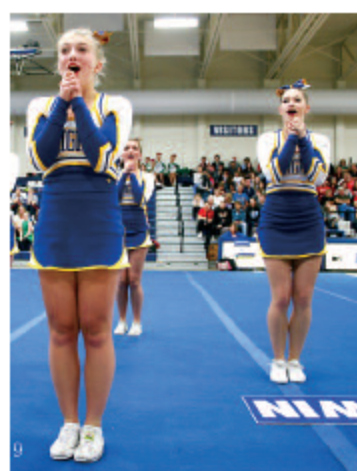

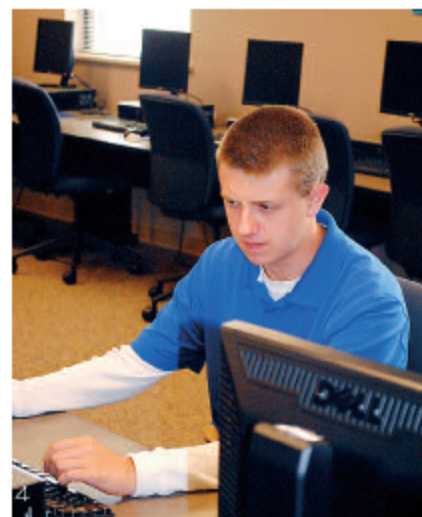

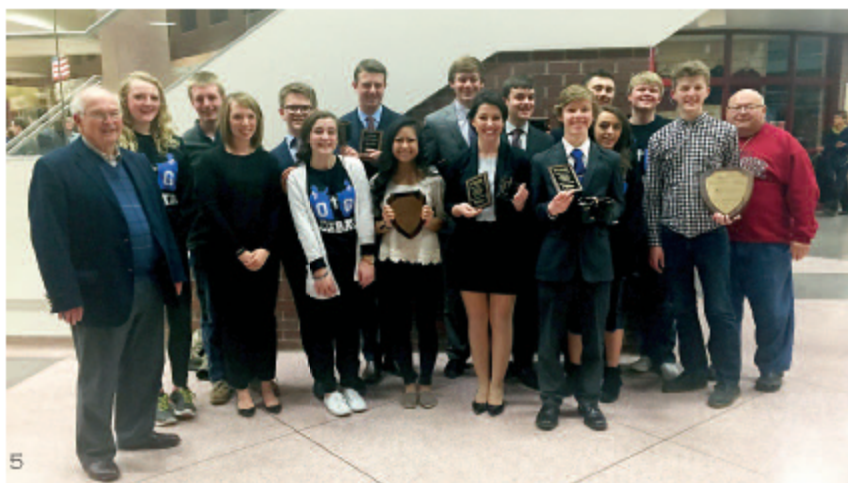
Debate

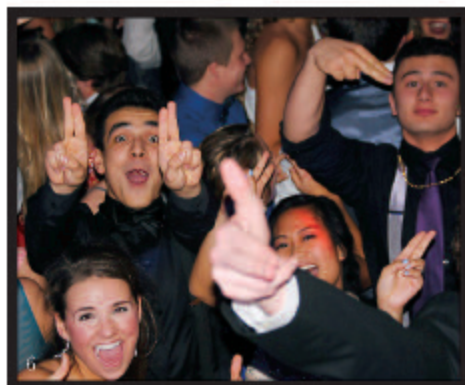

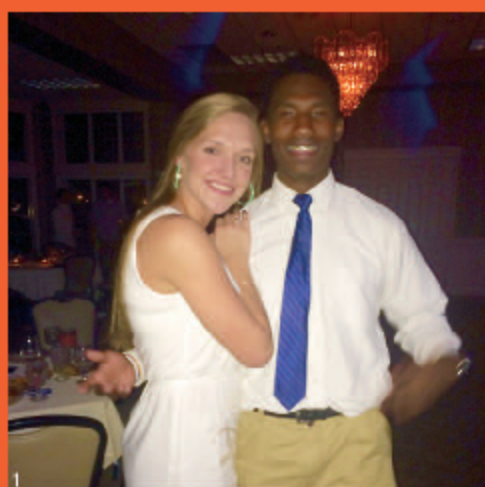
