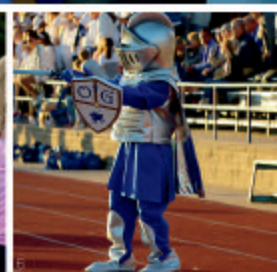

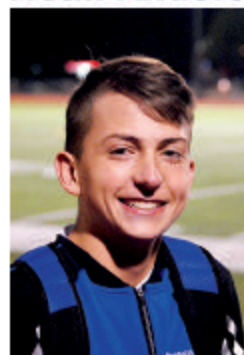

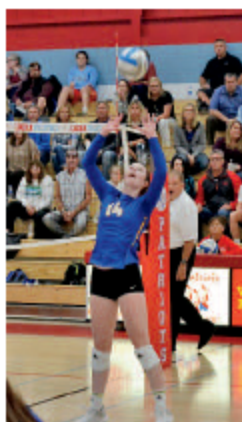

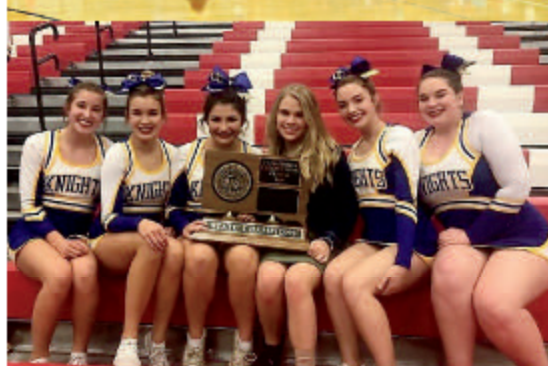
BOYS Serves Up! Tennis

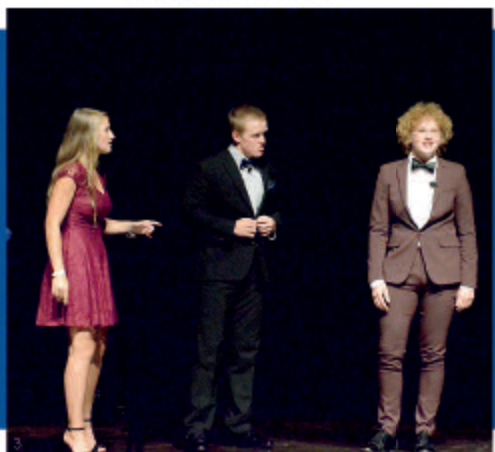

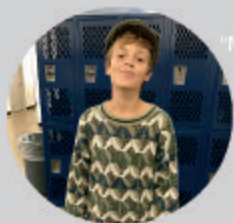

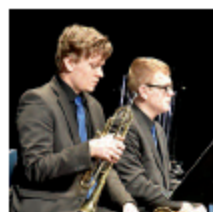

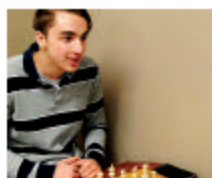
Chess Club

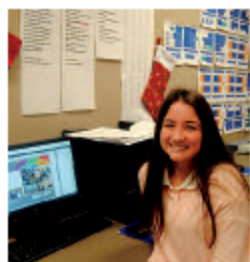

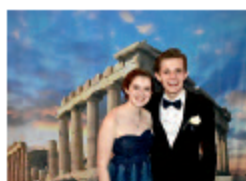
