At our 2019 homecoming game Kadus Gebreziabher is captured in the moments between coming on the field and starting the last homecoming game of his high school career.



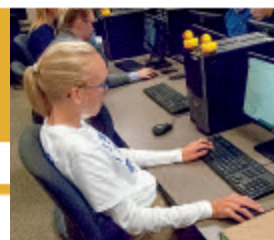

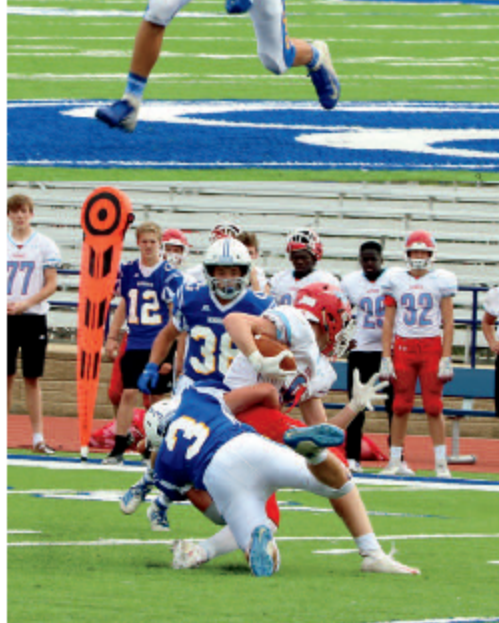

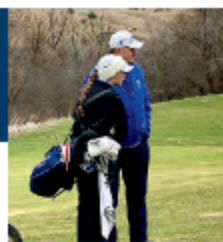

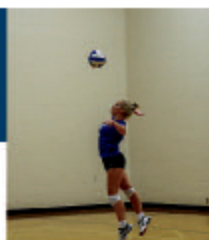

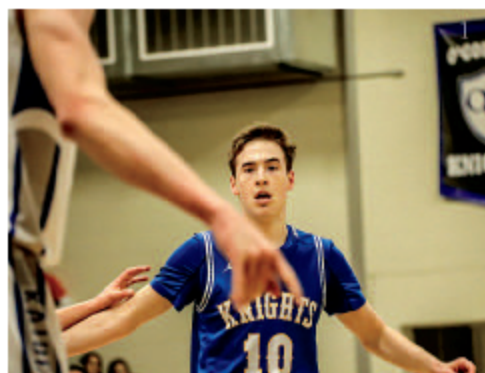

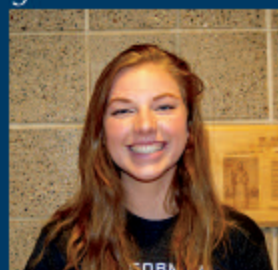

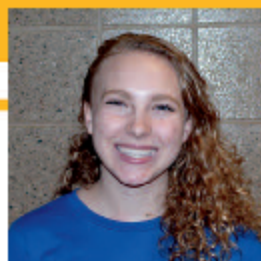

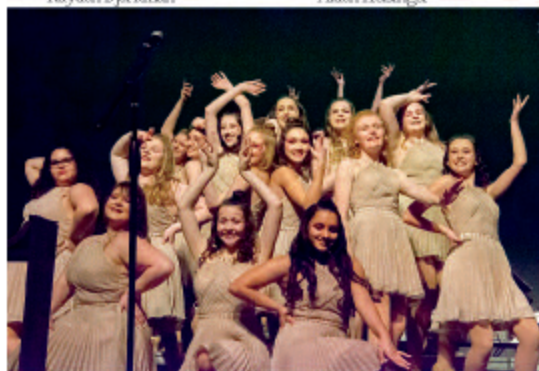
