ADDRESSING GROWING ENROLLMENT IN GRADES 6-12

For most of 2023, District Administration and the Parkland Board of School Directors studied options and gathered community feedback on how to address growing enrollment in grades 6-12. After studying cost projections and looking at many options, the Parkland School Board and Administration moved forward with planning a 60,000 square foot addition at Parkland High School and an addition and renovations at Orefield Middle School. This decision aligns with community input favoring one high school. It also addresses infrastructure needs for the next decade without buying land or building a new school - costlier options with longer timelines. SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Parkland Community,

It's springtime in Parkland, and there is so much to celebrate! Our sports teams have had so much success this past fall and winter and it is great to see our students back outside all over the PHS campus as they get outside for spring sports. Spring also marks the time when our PHS students put on the annual stage show, which this year is The SpongeBob Musical. We are also excited about the Prom, which, for the first time in many years, is not taking place on Mother's Day weekend! It will be on May 4th at SteelStacks and we are seeking a title sponsor, donations of food, prizes, and volunteers for the Post Prom Party (11 PM - 5 AM at Parkland High School after the Prom), which is designed to keep our seniors safe on Prom Night. Attendance is usually around 1,000 students. If you can help, please contact our Office of Communications and Community Engagement at 610-351-5630.

Our Administrative team and School Board continue to plan for the future of Parkland. As such, the District has contracted with Alloy5 to design an addition to Parkland High School and renovate and expand Orefield Middle School. After exploring many options, the Administration is moving forward with expansion plans for PHS and OMS at a cost of \$210M rather than build a 2nd high school and/or a 3rd middle school. To build two new schools, the costs were estimated at \$250M for a new high school and \$160M for a new middle school - a grand total of \$410M. As you can see on the cover of this publication, Parkland High School will gain additions under the plan. The additions will add 26 classrooms, 8 science labs, 4 large group instruction spaces, 4 general labs, additional cafeteria and nurse's suite space, as well as connect wings at the back of the building to improve traffic flow. The construction project at Parkland High School is slated to commence next year, followed by the project at Orefield Middle School. The OMS site will undergo significant infrastructure upgrades and safety enhancements. These improvements include relocating the bus lot, fueling stations, and bus garage, as well as upgrading the sewer system and addressing stadium considerations. The parking area will be expanded to accommodate more vehicles. Sidewalk repairs will be undertaken to ensure safe pedestrian access. Additionally, new traffic patterns featuring dedicated loops for bus drop-off and parent pick-up will be implemented, alleviating congestion and bolstering safety during high-traffic periods. A new addition at OMS will include team-oriented spaces for middle school teaching teams and allow us to balance the enrollment between the two Parkland Middle Schools. Regular updates will be made during Parkland School Board meetings, on social media, and on our webpage: www.parklandsd.org/Vision2030.

In addition to studying the enrollment and seating capacity across our school district, Parkland developed a 5-year capital improvement budget plan to ensure maintenance of our facilities. To maintain facilities, this summer, the District will: install new lights at the PHS turf stadium, upgrade HVAC and replace flooring at Kernsville Elementary, refinish the PHS gym floor, replace the boiler at Springhouse Middle School, renovate Fogelsville Elementary's playground and basement classrooms, and install bipolar ionization units in all elementary schools.

Spring is also a time when we begin finalizing the budget for the upcoming school year. I am pleased to report that the School Board has already passed a resolution that promises not to exceed the State's Act 1 Index threshold for Parkland of 5.3%. Revenue is slowing as real estate values are not increasing as rapidly as they have over the last couple of years. Key dates in the budget timeline appear in the box to the left and I invite the community to contact me directly with any questions or concerns related to the budget.

Parkland was pleased to be presented with a Great PA Schools Designation award from the Pennsylvania School Boards Association. The designation recognizes public schools that provide students with access to rigorous programming, are community-centric, demonstrate financial well-being and display resilience. Parkland School District was awarded a ribbon valid for a four-year term through an application and review process. Pictured below are my core leadership team and some School Board members receiving the award: Me, Tim Chorones, Leslie Frisbie, Michelle Minotti, Carol Facchiano, David Hein and Chris Pirrotta.

Spring marks the time when the Superintendent's Parkland Pride Award nomination form opens. I am happy to continue that long-standing tradition and invite community members to nominate Parkland staff or volunteers who have gone the extra mile this school year to make you proud to live in Parkland or be a part of the Parkland staff. 


