Diversity, Equity & Inclusion (DEI)

The Board of Education has named Dr. Marlowe Washington as facilitator of the school district's Diversity, Equity & Inclusion initiative. Dr. Washington is the Senior Diversity Officer at St. John Fisher College and has consulted on DEI initiatives at Brighton Central Schools. Before that, Dr. Washington served as an Adjunct Professor of Religion & Philosophy at Roberts Wesleyan College

and is the pastor of Seneca United Methodist Church in Irondequoit. He visited our schools to meet students, teachers and staff on October 5. Speaking at the Board of Education meeting the night before his visit, Dr. Washington explained his approach as engaging district students and families and engendering an environment of belonging and, in his words, "creating a common ground of oneness."

The district's first Diversity Equity and Inclusion Core Committee meeting

was held October 27. A cross-section of our community was represented - students, parents, teachers, staff, administration and school board.







Meet our two new Assistant Principals!

Meet Ms. Kate Orem, Elementary School Assistant Principal



Ms. Orem grew up in Rochester's 19th Ward in the southwest section of the city and graduated from Wilson Magnet High School. After graduating from Earlham College in Indiana with a degree in psychology and music, she first worked as manager of a Pennsylvania farm stand.

It wasn't long before she found her way into a school, working as a substitute paraprofessional. When she started

writing lesson plans in her dreams, she realized her calling to become a teacher. Ms. Orem enrolled at the University of Rochester where she earned first her Master's Degree in Elementary Education and later her Administrative Certification.

She taught in several schools in the city school district for more than two decades before coming to Wheatland-Chili in July as the Assistant Principal at T. J. Connor Elementary School.

Of her new role, Ms. Orem said she "comes home from work smiling every day, because of the caring community coming together to educate kids" at Wheatland-Chili.

Her love for educating young people runs deep in her family tree. She's a fourth-generation educator! And it's not likely to stop there. Of her three children, her daughter has already indicated she wants to be a kindergarten teacher.

The Orem household is also home to a black cat named Ash. They live in Brighton.

Outside of school, you can find Ms. Orem exercising her love of singing in various choral activities. She has sung in the supporting vocal groups in local performances by Bobby McFerrin and noted opera singer Kathleen Battle. She also enjoys hiking and meals made with fresh food grown by local farmers.

When asked what she gets out of her career, she said, "The joy of knowing I'm part of moving the world forward" by educating children.

Building upon the District's strong sense of community is clearly a passion for Ms. Orem.

Her favorite moments so far have been getting to know the students at T. J. Connor.

When asked what she hopes to accomplish, she responds, "Each kid gets the best education they could possibly get."

And she added, "I never met a parent who didn't want the best for their child."

Meet Mr. Matthew Hennard, Middle/High School Assistant Principal



Growing up on a farm in Perry, Mr. Hennard was the only child in his household to graduate from high school.

In speaking of students who may struggle with school, his advice, based on seeing his own brothers struggle, is "Your past doesn't dictate your future."

The 9/11 terror attacks motivated him to enlist in the U.S. Air Force for four years. His

service included a tour in Iraq.

When his time in the Air Force wrapped up, he went to SUNY Brockport and became a high school social studies teacher. He was hired to teach in the Holley Central School District starting with the 2010-2011 school year. In his 10 years there, he completed his administrative certification – also at SUNY Brockport. He started in his new position as Assistant Principal at Wheatland-Chili Middle/High School on July 1.

"I'm here to support the kids and support the teachers...and make everybody else's job easier," said Mr. Hennard of his role.

He enjoys getting to be in the hallways and classrooms working with kids and teachers.

When asked what he hopes to accomplish, Mr. Hennard added, "I hope to help continue making Wheatland-Chili the great place it is to work and learn, and get a great education."

His satisfaction comes from hearing former students speak of their successes.

Outside of school, Mr. Hennard likes to play basketball, softball, tennis, and video games. He and his family also enjoy camping.

He thinks you might be surprised to know that he hunts and enjoys life on a farm while having a lifelong interest in fashion.

At home, he and his wife are parents to two sons, ages 6 and 9. The family has several pets: two golden doodles, two cats and a snake! The Hennards are excited about their eventual move from Brockport into a new home under construction in Chili in a neighboring district.

His favorite moment so far came while walking into a girls' soccer game. The student section screamed his name and wanted him to sit with them in the bleachers. He said that gesture made him feel "welcomed, safe and comfortable."
