Dear Parents of Grazide Elementary,

The State of California allocates funding to school districts based on the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). LCFF consists of base, supplemental and concentration grant funding that allocates resources based upon the district's pupil demographics. The goal of LCFF is to increase flexibility and accountability at the local level. The funds must be spent to increase or improve services for all students. Districts and schools with high percentages of low income, English learners, and foster youth will receive Supplemental and Concentration Grant Funds in addition to LCFF Base Grant Funds.

LCFF requires each school district to develop a Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) and annual update that describes for the district and each school within the district specific goals and actions to achieve the goals set by the State of California in eight priority areas. In order to do so, meaningful engagement of all staff and parent groups is critical to the annual LCAP and LCFF budget process.

Educational partners' outreach for the annual LCAP update process includes opportunities for your input on LCAP priorities. In addition to the discussions we have had during School Site Council (SSC) and English Learners Advisory Council (ELAC), we want to hear from all our community.

The next meetings at Grazide Elementary will be held on Tuesday, March 9, 2024.
