A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPALS

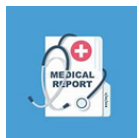

COUNSELORS' CORNER



This month at PVE, it is Career Awareness Month. Learning about different careers is important for a child's development and increases the likelihood that a child will graduate from high school. Here are some ways that you can help your child with career exploration:

- 2) talk to people in different occupations
- 3) help your child learn about their interests (ask them questions about things they enjoy)
- 4) try to limit your opinions (you may need to research an occupation)
