Running Start (RS) is a statewide partnership between Washington's 34 community and technical colleges and local high schools. Running Start (RS) allows high school juniors and seniors to take classes at the college tuition-free. Students earn both high school and college credit at the same time. The high school pays for the college credits, which saves families money as students begin their college careers.

- Tuition is free for college credits approved by the high school.
- Students pay for class and student fees, books and other supplies needed for class.
 - Some low-income students may qualify for a fee waiver.
- Students take classes at the college on campus or online.
- Students may choose to attend part-time or full-time.
- The number of tuition-free credits depends on the number of classes taken at the high school.
- Students are responsible for mandatory fees, books, parking, and any transportation costs.

High school juniors and seniors can take up to 15 college credits per quarter at Cascadia College. The public school district pays Running Start tuition. Students can enroll in Fall, Winter, and Spring quarters, for a maximum of six quarters. Students can apply to begin as a Running Start in any of these quarters.

Students earn high school and college credits simultaneously. Each five-credit Cascadia course will earn one year of the subject at the high school. For example, a student taking English 101 at Cascadia will earn one year of high school English. Students have access to any Cascadia course for which they meet the prerequisite.

Some students choose to take some of their classes at the high school and others at the college. Students who take some classes at their high school will be eligible for fewer credits of free tuition at Cascadia. Students can pay for additional credits above the number of eligible credits.

Running Start is a great option for motivated, independent students who are ready to accomplish college-level work. Running Start students must meet the same academic expectations as other Cascadia students. Cascadia grades appear on both the high school and college transcript.

The Running Start program is one of many dual enrollment options available at Lake Washington Institute of Technology. Students classified as high school juniors and seniors may apply. Tuition is covered through Running Start, therefore Running Start saves money. In addition, Running Start students get started on college early, so they save time as they work towards their educational goals.
