

### WINTER WEATHER TIPS FOR STUDENT METRO RIDERS

Winter weather in this area can make travel very unpredictable. Many LWSD students rely on Metro to get them to and from school. Metro would like you to be reminded of possible delays, route changes or cancellations because of winter weather.

When waiting for a bus in these conditions, the best place to catch the bus is along a major arterial. Wait at the top or bottom of hills, and wait back from the curb. Please remember that Metro buses may be more crowded than usual and not always on schedule, so dress warmly and be prepared for delays.



### MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

Students are NOT allowed to have medication at school, this includes non-prescription medication like Advil, Tylenol, etc. All medication must be cleared through the Emerson Office, contact Sally Jenkins, our Health Room Office Professional as soon as possible.

Parents/guardians are responsible for:

- Supplying all medications/transporting medication to and from school.
- Completing required <u>medication authorization forms</u>. An <u>authorization to</u>
   <u>administer medication form</u> must be turned in for each medication whether
   prescription or non-prescription. The form must be signed by the health
   care provider and parent and/or guardian. Medication cannot be given without the completed form.
- ♦ All prescribed medication must be in the original, labeled prescription bottle, container or package.
- All non-prescription medication must be in original container and labeled by the parent, <u>including</u>: Student Name, Medication Name, Dosage, Date Issued, Name of Health Care Provider, and Time medication is to be given.

Scheduled medications are given between 11:00 AM - 1:00 PM only.

### BAER REINTEGRATION SCHOLARSHIP—10 AWARDS OF \$5,000

Until recently, the idea that people with schizophrenia or bipolar disorder could move their lives forward or even reintegrate into their communities was thought by many to be unrealistic and unobtainable. But with the advent of newer medications, lives have been transformed.

However, medication is only the first step. The support of people and programs in the community is essential. Opening the door to educational opportunities is one way to help people with schizophrenia or bipolar disorder transition from a world of chaos and withdrawal to one of accomplishment.

The goal of the Baer Reintegration Scholarship is to help people with schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorder or bipolar disorder acquire the educational and vocational skills necessary to reintegrate into society, secure jobs, and regain their lives.

The Baer Reintegration Scholarship is funded by the Sidney R. Baer, Jr. Foundation which supports the efforts of organizations working to stimulate education, research and direct care in the mental health field. A businessman and consultant, Mr. Baer personally faced mental health challenges during his life and sought to alleviate the suffering of those living with mental illness.

To be eligible for the scholarship, a student must:

- Be diagnosed with bipolar disorder, schizophrenia, or schizoaffective disorder
- Be age 18 years or older by the beginning of the 2024-2025 academic school year.
