

2024-25 Budget Timeline

January 2024	01/15/24 to 01/31/24	The Superintendent and cabinet begin regular discussion of the priorities for the 2024-25 fiscal year with consideration of the Strategic Plan/BP2030 & Board Policy 4.4.
January 2024	01/31/24	The Research Department provides <u>first draft of student</u> enrollment by building and grade for the 2024-25 school year based on current enrollment, the city's enrollment trends and birth rates.
February 2024	02/28/24	The Research Department provides <u>final student enrollment projections</u> based on January 2023 membership counts, enrollment trends and birth rates.
February 2024	02/21/24	Present to the Board the preliminary three-year <u>revenue plan</u> for FY25, FY26, and FY27.
March 2024	03/01/24	Individual buildings (Signature Schools) and departmental budget worksheets are prepared by the Budget Department and provided to budget managers to review and prepare their department budget plans for 2024-25.
March 2024	03/15/24	Departments submit their budget requests/savings plans to the Budget department. Please make sure your Cabinet member has approved in writing prior to submitting your budget plan to the Budget Department.
April 2024	04/17/24 04/23/24 04/25/24 04/29/24 05/01/24	MFT Principal Advisory Student Advisory Teacher Advisory District Advisory Committee
April 2024	04/08/24	The <u>Superintendent and cabinet members determine the approved requests</u> for the 2024-25 budget and provide those to the budget department.
April 2024	04/24/24	A <u>budget</u> workshop is held with the Board of Education to review details of the proposed budget for 2024-25.
May 2024	05/21/24	Review with the Finance & Audit Committee the recommended FY25 budget plan.
May 2024	05/22/24	<u>Public budget hearing is</u> held to share budget priorities and planning and receive input from all stakeholders.
May 2024	05/22/24	The <u>final FY24 budget document is</u> recommended to the Board of Education for adoption by May 22, 2024.





What is the KCPS Early College Academy

- Early College Academy (ECA) is a student-centered program for highly motivated 11th and 12th grade students earning college credits while in high school.
- ECA is a partnership between Kansas City Public Schools, Metropolitan Community College – Penn Valley, and University of Missouri Kansas City.

What pathways are offered at the KCPS Early College Academy – UMKC/MCC

UMKC/MCC Pathways offered through the KCPS Early College Academy:

UMKC

- **Performing Arts** (Theatre and Music),
- Early Childhood and Elementary Education,
- **Engineering** (Civil, Electrical, or Mechanical), and
- *Medicine B.A./M.D. Program* (Pre-courses for Liberal Arts Chemistry, Biology or Pharmacy).

• MCC

- 2 Year College Degree Associates

2024/2025 SY – 1st Semester Application Process

KCPS - UMKC Early College Academy is a program dedicated to highly motivated students who earn college credits while in high school. The Early College Academy (ECA) is a partnership between Kansas City Public Schools (KCPS) and the University of Missouri - Kansas City (UMKC). The pathway focus areas are Performing Arts (Theatre and Music), Early Childhood and Elementary Education, Engineering (Civil, Electrical, or Mechanical) and Medicine -B.A./M.D. Program (Pre-courses for Liberal Arts - Chemistry, Biology or Pharmacy).

RISING 11th or 12th GRADER ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- Student will be on a half-day schedule in Fall '24
- Attends a current Kansas City Public Schools High School
- High School Transcript with a 3.25 cumulative GPA and on track for graduation



Eligibility Requirements

STEP 1: Complete the KCPS Google Online

STEP 2: Complete the KCPS Schools Early College Academy – UMKC Online Application

STEP 3: Obtain a copy of your high school transcript with ACT or ACCUPLACER scores (Accuplacer can be taken for "FREE" at MCC-Penn Valley - register at mcckc.edu/apply and bring your school ID to test)

STEP 4: Submit the following documents:

- A letter of recommendation from a current teacher or counselor AND a school administrator or someone of your choice that can speak to your preparation and motivation to succeed in a college environment. (The letter of recommendation cannot be written by family members, friends, classmates, or
- Current Official High School Transcript with ACT or ACCUPLACER Scores
- Submit one (1) essay (minimum of 500 words) Why should you be selected to attend the Early College Academy, and what do you want to study at UMKC?

Final Submission Process

By applying to the KCPS - Early College Academy at UMKC, the student and parents would be committing to the following:

- · Own transportation to and from the UMKC Campus (Transportation can be provided, if
- Attend UMKC college courses based on their daily college schedule
- · Check in and out daily in the ECA's Homeroom on UMKC Campus
- · Check out and return college course textbooks at end of semester
- Passing all courses with a "C" or higher

If accepted, you will be required to attend an ECA/UMKC New Student Orientation at UMKC.

Early College Academy SY 2024-2025 Application Process

KCPS Early College Academy is a program dedicated to highly motivated students who earn high school credits and college credits towards a high school diploma and an Associate of Arts degree. The Early College Academy (ECA) is a partnership between Kansas City Public Schools (KCPS) and Metropolitan Community College - Penn Valley (MCC).

10th GRADER ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

- Current 10th grader (Attend KCPS, charter, private or home-schooled)
- Live within the Kansas City Public Schools District boundaries
- High School Transcript with a 3.25 cumulative GPA in 10th grade (Completed Fall Semester)

Eligibility Requirements

STEP 1: Apply for admissions to MCC- Penn Valley as a high school student (FREE) at mcckc.edu/apply for the Associate of Arts Degree plan.

STEP 2: Take the Next-Gen. Accuplacer Test (FREE) in Reading, Writing, and Math at MCC Testing Center:

- Must score in Reading, 248 or higher (Recommended or Not Required)
- Must score in Writing, 242-245 & No Reading Required or 246 or higher (Eng. 101)
- Must score in QAS, 241 or higher and/AFF 237 or higher (Math 95 or higher)

an ACT score of 21 or higher in each content area

STEP 3: Complete ECA Interest Application at: https://forms.gle/PNtcgRFigU4xv9gs7 (Current KCPS Students skip to Step 5)

Final Submission Process

STEP 4: (NEW STUDENTS ONLY) Enroll in the KCPS district through the KCPS Online Application -Enrollment starts on January 18, 2024, at kepublicschools.org.

STEP 5: Submit the following documents:

- Two (2) letters of recommendation from a current teacher or counselor AND a school administrator or someone of your choice that can speak to your preparation and motivation to succeed in a college environment. (The letter of recommendation cannot be written by family members, friends, classmates, or teammates.)
- Current Official High School Transcript
- Most Recent Accuplacer test scores
- Submit two essays (minimum of 500 words)
- 1) How will earning a college degree enable you to reach your personal and career goals?
- 2) Why should you be selected to attend the Early College Academy?
