#### **How to Register**

- Register online with a credit card payment using VISA, Mastercard, Discover or American Express: www.muhs.edu/summer-camps/summer-explore
- Program registration is limited and is based on a policy of first-come, first-served paid registrations.
- Full payment is due with the registration. Program spots cannot be reserved for those not paid in full.
- Register students for the grade level they will enter in fall 2024.

#### **Program Cancellation/Refund Policy**

Marquette High reserves the right to close programs with maximum enrollment and to cancel programs that do not meet the minimum enrollment 14 days prior to the program starting date. In the event a program is cancelled by the school, participants will receive a full refund.

Families who voluntarily withdraw from the program 14 days or more before the program start date will receive a full refund less a \$10 administrative fee. Refunds will not be given for cancellations that are less than 14 days prior to the program start date. These program fees may be applied to another 2024 Summer EXPLORE! class if space is available.

If a student voluntarily withdraws after the first day of the program start date, no refund will be issued. There is no pro-rated adjustment of the program fees based on the number of days attended.

#### **Student Behavior**

Appropriate student behavior is expected. If a student's behavior makes it difficult for others to learn and enjoy their experiences or for teachers to teach, the summer program coordinator reserves the right to discuss the situation with the student and parents, and if a remedy cannot be initiated, to require the student to withdraw from the program without a refund.

#### Illness

If a student becomes ill, Marquette High will contact parents and ask that their student be picked up from summer programs or sport camps. Refunds will not be issued based on missed days due to illness.

#### Insurance

Marquette High does not carry medical or hospital insurance for injuries or illness a participant may sustain in the summer programs. Parents of students participating in Marquette High-sponsored activities must provide their own insurance and assume the risks of all injuries or accidents.

#### **First Day Procedures**

Summer EXPLORE! programs will be held at Marquette University High School unless indicated otherwise. Enter at the Henke Center Entrance at 3306 W. Michigan. Students will check in before reporting to the location of their program. If you plan to come in with your student, please park in any of the available parking spaces. The first day check-in procedures will be sent to families as part of the reminder email families will receive during the week prior to the first day of class.

#### Lunch

If your son is participating in a morning and afternoon class or sport camp, he is welcome to bring a lunch and beverage. An area will be designated for students to have lunch between classes.

#### **Dress Code**

General guidelines for summer programs:

- Pants/Shorts: Students may wear casual pants or jeans or cargo-type shorts. They should be neat, clean and without rips or frays. Cut-offs are not permitted. Pants and shorts must be worn at waist level at all times. Students may wear athletic pants or shorts if they are attending a sport camp.

#### AAA Program - Academics, Arts & Athletics

For boys entering grades 6, 7, 8

The AAA Program stands for the three components of the program: Academics, Arts and Athletics. Each of these components will be incorporated into daily activities to build relationships, practice skills, and prepare students for a Marquette High environment. The AAA Program captures a central priority of a Marquette High education: forming the whole person. In an active, fun, engaging learning environment, students will gain a small glimpse of life at Marquette High. Fun and challenging lessons taught by MUHS faculty will prepare students for the active learning environment at MUHS. In athletics, students will participate in team sports such as soccer, flag football, kickball or ultimate Frisbee. Current students will assist MUHS faculty throughout the program.

#### **FINANCE**

#### Stock Markets & Investing: Course 1

For boys entering grades 6, 7, 8, and MUHS Grade 9

Tesla! Bitcoin! & NFTs! Everywhere you look these days, stock markets and investing are all the rage. Want to start to learn about what it means to invest? This camp is designed to allow students to gain knowledge and skills in the areas of investment vocabulary and decision-making, including stocks, bonds, mutual funds and other financial instruments. Students will learn about and see how the Marquette University High School Ignatian Student Investment Fund is an example of prudent, long-term investing. In this interactive course, students will participate in a stock market simulation as well as other financial activities and games to enhance their learning experience.

#### Stock Markets & Investing: Course 2

For boys entering grades 7, 8, and MUHS Grade 9

Prerequisite: 2021, 2022 or 2023 Stock Markets & Investing: Course 1

This companion course will provide students the opportunity to do a deeper dive into the financial metrics surrounding investing. Students will learn more about differences in investing philosophies and begin to formulate their own opinions about useful metrics for picking successful investments. Students will be given a chance to research a company and be coached through how to put together an investment proposal, mirrored after that used by the Marquette University High School Ignatian Student Investment Fund. Two sessions of the same class are being offered.

For students entering grades 8, 9 (girls from any school, grade 8 boys from any school, MUHS grade 9)

Recommended for students in Honors or Advanced Math

Is your son or daughter fascinated by the world of mathematics? Discover interesting mathematical topics not typically taught in middle school or high school math classes! Many of the topics are taken from high school (e.g., AMC) and middle school (e.g., MATHCOUNTS) competitions. The topics rotate each session so that a student who participates in the program repeatedly will not see the same material twice.
