From the Desk of the Superintendent

As we transition into March, we are filled with excitement for the opportunities it brings to celebrate learning and growth within our school district. Spring is a time to embrace the renewal of learning and growth within our school community. March marks a pivotal moment in the academic calendar, where we not only celebrate the gradual thaw of winter but also the blossoming of new opportunities for our students. With only 48 days left, it is crucial that you are in school every day. Research shows that there is a strong correlation between attendance and success in school.

With Option Enrollment forms coming in quickly, I would like to review our procedures and important dates concerning Option Enrollment.

Important Dates for Option Enrollment:

- March 15th Option Enrollment Forms without approval from the resident school district are due.
- After March 15th The resident school district must sign off or approve the option form before a student tries to transfer schools.
- April 1st Lakeview must approve/deny all option forms that were received by the March 15th deadline.
- March 15th to July 31st Lakeview may accept option forms that have been approved by resident districts.
- May 1st Any student wanting to participate in NSAA Activities must be on the NSAA May 1st Transfer List
- July 31st LCS will no longer accept option students for the upcoming school year.

Capacity Limits:

Lakeview accepts all students based on the capacity limits outlined in the board policy. These capacity limits differ based on classroom, grade level, and building capacity. Students who have an IEP will be determined on a case-by-case basis.

Criteria for Acceptance:

Lakeview has a system to move students up and down the order of acceptance. The following criteria for acceptance are used when determining which student gets placed at the top or bottom of the list of option enrollment applications:

- 1st Priority Siblings of current Option students (state statute)
- 2nd Priority Students that have attended a parochial school located within district boundaries for seven consecutive vears.
- 3rd Priority Children of employees working for the district.
- 4th Priority Students that have attended a parochial school located within district boundaries for two consecutive years.
- 5th Priority Students submitted option paperwork closest to September 1st.

Highlighting Student Achievements:

We take pride in the accomplishments of our students both inside and outside the classroom. From academic achievements to artistic endeavors and athletic victories, our students continue to showcase their talents and dedication. We commend their hard work and encourage them to pursue their passions with confidence and enthusiasm.

Nurturing Wellness and Mental Health:

As we prioritize academic success, we also recognize the importance of supporting the overall well-being of our students and staff. March is National Nutrition Month, serving as a reminder of the importance of maintaining a healthy lifestyle. Additionally, with World Sleep Day falling on March 15th, we emphasize the significance of adequate rest and self-care practices for optimal performance and mental health.

Shell Creek Updates

5th Grade Happenings!

Reading - 5th Graders have been reading a novel called Esperanza Rising, returning from Christmas break. The novel focuses on Esperanza, the only daughter of wealthy Mexican parents, and follows the events that occur after her father's murder. Esperanza, her mother, and their former household servants flee to California with no money during the Great Depression, where they find agricultural work that pays very little. The novel then focuses on all the hardships they endure to start a new life in America. Students have really enjoyed reading the story and learning about a different culture. As we read, students had the opportunity to try many new/different types of foods that they might not normally eat and were pleasantly surprised about whether or not they enjoyed them. We wrapped up our unit by writing postcards from our main character to their Abuelita, written as if they were the main character of the story.



5th graders have been researching and learning about all things space! So far we have discussed how fast the Earth really spins, how the idea of a clock came about, how the sun can tell us the seasons, constellations and how the constellations we see at night change with the seasons, and the different moon phases and why the moon changes shape. Students are currently researching all the planets and working on a planet project in small groups. In their groups they are learning how far each planet is away from the sun and each other, and the varying sizes of each planet. We will also be learning about the levels of gravity on different planets.5th graders will also be identifying if it would be possible to live on any other planet based on the amount of light each receives, the level of gravity, the amount of oxygen each has for life to grow, and if water exists on each planet.

On February 27th & 28th, 5th Graders will be participating in 4H Leadership Day. Students learned exactly what leadership is, entails, and looks like. Students then took a survey to figure out what type of Leadership qualities they possess. Shell students Creek soon realized their similarities and differences with their classmates and how that affects their thinking and actions. Students were later immersed into many leadership activities. Students really saw what it was like to work together as a team and how a leader can impact the work done!Overall, students learned discussed leadership qualities that can be used in the classroom and everyday life along with realizing the differences that make up our unique classrooms.




