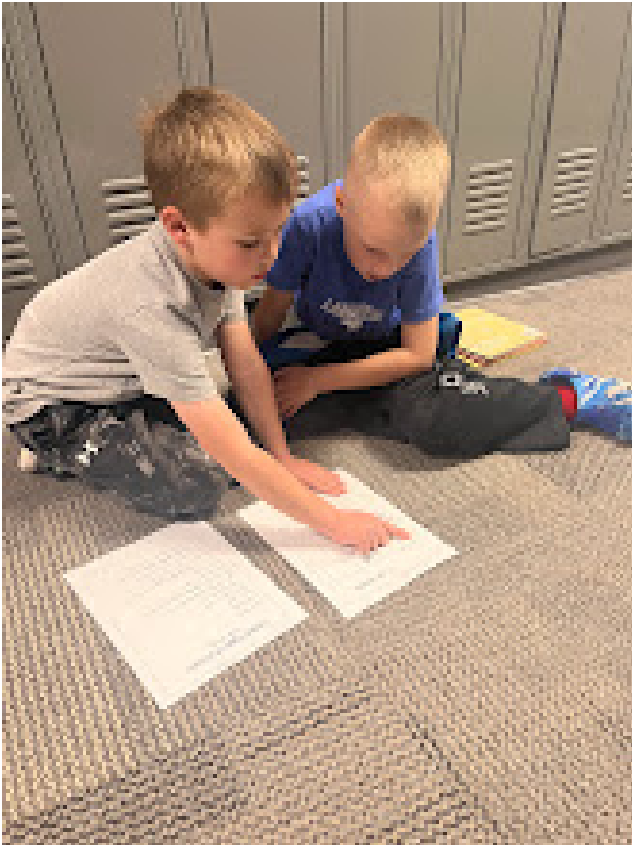


Shell Creek Updates
